DIRECTIONS

Easy

SIZE

11 inches long

MATERIALS

- · 4-ply yarn:
 - 3½ oz dark purple
 - 11/2 oz lilac
 - 2 oz white
 - Small amount of black
- · Crochet hook size F/5
- · Fiberfill
- · Yarn needle

GAUGE

4 sc = 1 inch; 4 sc rnds = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rnds unless otherwise indicated. Use a scrap of CC yarn to mark rnds.

TEDDY

HEAD

Rnd 1: Starting at top of head, with lilac yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around. (12)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (18)

Rnd 4: [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (24)

Rnd 5: [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in

next sc] rep around. (30)

Rnd 6: Sc in each sc around.

Rnds 7-12: Rep Rnd 6.

Stuff head with fiberfill and continue stuffing as work progresses.

Rnd 13: [Sc in next 3 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] rep around. (24)

Rnd 14: Rep Rnd 6.

Rnd 15: [Sc in next 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] rep around. (18)

Rnd 16: [Sc in next 4 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] rep around. (15)

Rnd 17: Rep Rnd 6, sl st in back lp only of next sc, fasten off.

BODY

Rnd 18: Working in back lps for this rnd only, attach dark purple yarn, [sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (18)

Rnd 19: [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (24)

Rnd 20: [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (30)

Rnd 21: [Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (36)

Rnds 22-33: Rep Rnd 6.

Rnd 34: [Sc in next 4 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] rep around. (30)

Rnd 35: [Sc in next 3 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] rep around. (24)

Rnd 36: [Sc in next 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] rep around. (18)

Rnd 37: [Sc in next sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] rep around. (12)

Rnd 38: [Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] rep around, sl st in next sc, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (6)

Sew opening closed.

Flatten head and body in opposite directions. Bear will be sleeping on tummy with head turned to the left.

COLLAR

Rnd 1: Attach white yarn in rem free lp of Rnd 17, ch 1, work 2 sc in each rem free lp around, sl st to join in beg sc, turn. (30)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc, do not turn. (45)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off. (60)

MUZZLE

Rnd 1: With white yarn, ch 2, 6 se in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around (12)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (18)

Rnds 4 & 5: Sc in each sc around.

At the end of Rnd 5, sl st in next sc, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Sew muzzle over Rnds 9-15 of head, stuffing with fiberfill as work progresses.

EARS Ear front (make 2)

Rnd 1: With white yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around. (12)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st in next sc, fasten off. (18)

Ear back (make 2)

Rnds 1 & 2: With lilac yarn, rep Rnds 1 and 2 of ear front. (12) Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (18)

Rnd 4: Holding front and back of ear section together and working through both thicknesses, sc in each sc around, al st to join in beg sc, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (18)

Sew ears to Rnds 4-7 at each side of head.

NOSE

Row 1: With black yarn, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, turn. (1)

Row 2: Work 3 sc in the 1 sc st, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Sew nose over Rnds 1 and 2 of muzzle.

EYES (make 2) Pupils

Row 1: With black yarn, ch 2, 4 sc in 2nd ch from hook, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (4)

Leaving 3 sts between pupils, sew pupils above muzzle.

Eyelids

Row 1: With lilac yarn, ch 4, so in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next ch, 2 sc in next ch, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (8)

With foundation ch horizontal to face, sew eyelids at a slight angle to top half of each pupil.

ARMS (make 2)

Rnd 1: With lilac yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around. (12)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (15)

Rnds 4 & 5: Sc in each sc around. At the end of Rnd 5, sl st in back lp only of next sc to join, fasten off.

Rnd 6: Working in back lps for this rnd only, attach dark purple yarn, sc in each st around.

Rnds 7–14: Sc in each sc around. Stuff arm with fiberfill.

Row 15: Fold Rnd 14 flat across and working through both thicknesses, work 7 sc across edge, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Arm ruffle

Rnd 1: Attach white yarn in rem free lp of Rnd 5, ch 1, work 2 sc in each rem free lp around, sl st to join in beg sc, do not turn. (30)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join, fasten off.

Sew arms to Rnds 20-25 of each side of body, be sure left arm sewn area is directly below muzzle.

LEGS (make 2)

Rnd 1: With lilac yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around. (12)

Rnd 3: |Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc| rep around. (18)

Rnds 4-6: Sc in each sc around.

At the end of Rnd 6, sl st in back lp only of next st, fasten off.

Rnd 7: Working in back lps for this rnd only, attach dark purple, sc in each st around. (18)

Rnds 8-16: Sc in each sc around.

Stuff leg with fiberfill.

Row 17: Fold piece flat across and working through both thicknesses, work 9 sc across edge, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Leg ruffle

Rnd 1: Attach white yarn in rem free lps of Rnd 6, ch 2, hdc in same at as ch-2, work 2 hdc in each rem free lp around, sl st to join in beg hdc, do not turn. (36)

Rnd 2: Ch 2, hdc in next hdc, 2 hdc in next hdc] rep around, sl st to join, fasten off.

Sew legs 6 rnds below arms to each side of body.

NIGHTCAP

Rnd 1: With dark purple yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 3: Sc around, inc 2 sc evenly sp around. (8)

Rnds 4-15: Rep Rnds 2 and 3.

Rnds 16-18: Rep Rnd 3. (26)

At the end of Rnd 18, sl st in next st, fasten off.

Rnd 19: Attach white yarn, sc in each sc around. (26)

Rnd 20: Sc in each sc around, sl st in next sc, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

POMPON

With white yarn, make a 1-inch pompon and attach to Rnd 1 of nightcap.

Fold hat downward at Rnd 8, tack in place to opposite edge of nightcap.

Do not stuff nightcap with fiberfill.

Place nightcap over left ear and sew Rnd 20 to head.

PILLOW

FRONT & BACK (make 2)

Row 1: With dark purple yarn, ch 24, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (23)

Rows 2-25: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

At the end of Row 25, fasten off.

EDGING

Rnd 1: Holding front and back of pillow together and working through both thicknesses, attach white, ch 1, sc evenly sp around entire outer edge, stuffing with fiberfill as work progresses, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join, fasten off.

Place teddy on his tummy on the pillow so that each arm is at 1 corner of the pillow. Tack Rnd 3 of each arm to the pillow. *

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Increase (inc): Sc, ch 1 and sc in same sc.

Decrease (dec): Draw up a lp in sc, draw up a lp in next sc, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook.

HELMET

Notes: Remove base from 2liter bottle.

From center bottom measure and mark bottle up at 7 inches all around; cut.

Place front edge of diagram of top opening (page 12) 5% inches from front bottom, mark and cut

out opening.

Cut 2 paper diagrams of shoulder cutouts. With helmet front facing, tape cutouts to each side and cut out openings.

DIRECTIONS

Easy

SIZE

Fits 12-inch soft-sculptured troll dolls

MATERIALS

- 4-ply yarn*: 3½ oz No 111 eggshell Small amounts No 253 tangerine, No 669 mint julep, No 12 black, No 412 silver, No 360 wood brown
- Crochet hook size G/6

Hot-glue gun

- Small amount tangerine felt
- · 2-liter plastic roundedbottom soda bottle
- Sharp cutting implement

2 snap fasteners

- 3-inch-diameter elastic band
- · Tape
- Scrap of fiberfill
- Sharp yarn needle

*Coats & Clark Red Heart Classic™ yarn was used in the sample project.

GAUGE

4 sc = 1 inch; 4 sc rows or rnds = 1 inch

Rnd 1: Starting at top of helmet, with eggshell yarn, ch 40, join to form a ring, ch 1, sc in each ch around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off, turn. (40)

Rnd 2: Draw up a lp of tangerine yarn, ch 1, sc in each sc around, al at to join in beg ac, turn.

Rnd 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off, turn.

Rnd 4: Draw up a lp of mint julep yarn, ch 1, sc in each sc around, at st to join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, al at to join in beg sc, fasten off, turn.

Row 6: Draw up a lp of eggshell yarn, ch 1, sc in next 28 sc (back of helmet), turn. (28)

Row 7: Ch 1, sc in next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 8 sc, turn. (30)

Row 8: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 9: Ch 1, [sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] 5 times, sc in next 5 sc. turn. (35)

Rows 10-12: Rep Row 8.

Row 13: Ch 1, sc in next 3 sc, sl st in next 6 sc (shoulder section), sc in next 17 sc, sl st in next 6 sc (shoulder section), sc in next 3 sc, ch 15, sl st in first sc of Row 13, sl st in next 2 sc, turn.

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in next 2 sc, sc in each of next 15 chs (front of helmet), sc in next 3 sc, turn. (21)

Row 15: Ch 1, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next 17 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, turn. (19)

Row 16: Ch 1, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next 15 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, turn. (17)

Rnd 17: Ch 1, sc in next 17 sc, sc in side edge of Rows 15 and 14, sc in next 6 sl sts, sc in next 17 sc, sc in next 6 sl sts, sc in side edge of Rows 14 and 15, sl st to join, fasten off.

Rnd 18: Attach eggshell yarn in opposite side of foundation ch of Rnd 1, ch 1, [sc in next 3 chs, dec 1 sc over next 2 chs| rep around, sl st to join in beg sc, do not turn.

Rnd 19: Working in top loops only, ch 1, sc in each st around, sl st to join in beg sc, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

FACE TRIM

Rnd 1: Attach eggshell yarn in front right bottom corner, ch 1, working around face opening, work 42 sc sts evenly sp around, sl st to join, fasten off.

Rnd 2: Attach mint julep yarn in any sc of Rnd 1, sl st in each sc around, fasten off.

Rnd 3: Attach tangerine yarn in any sc of Rnd 1, behind sl sts of Rnd 2, sl st in each st around, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Notes: Work the following steps very closely. They will eliminate all sharp edges of plastic bottle insert.

A sharp implement can be used to make small holes around top of helmet opening and bottom of helmet. Make small holes approximately 1/4 inch from edge.

Working with sharp yarn needle and eggshell yarn, place crocheted piece over plastic insert. Line up shoulder cutouts with al sts of Row Fold Rnd 19 under to inside of helmet, working through thicknesses of Rnd 19, plastic insert and Rnd 18 of helmet, sew all around, knot to secure, fasten off.

With sharp needle and length of eggshell yarn, fold Rnd 17 under to inside of helmet and working through all thicknesses, sew around entire outer edge, knot to secure, fasten off.

HELMET NUMBERS

From tangerine felt, cut out 4 helmet numbers. Glue two numbers to each side of helmet above shoulder cutouts and slightly below mint julep yarn.

SUIT

FRONT

Row 1 (Right side): Starting at neckline with eggshell yarn, ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk 1 ch, sc in next ch] 4 times, ch 1, turn. (5 sc)

Row 2: Inc in first sc, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp] 3 times, inc in next sc, fasten off, turn. (7 sc)

Row 3: Attach tangerine yarn, ch 1, se in first sc, [ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, sc in next sc| rep across, ch 1, turn.


Row 4: Inc in first sc, [ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, sc in next sc| 5 times, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, inc in last sc, fasten off, turn. (9 sc)





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

Rep leg ribbing in rem free lps of Row 12.

Row 1 (Right side): Starting at neckline edge of sleeve, with eggshell yarn, ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, [ch 1, sk 1 ch, sc in next ch] 4 times, ch 1, turn. (5 sc)

Row 2: Inc, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, [sc in next sc, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp] 3 times, inc, ch 1, turn. (7 sc)

At the end of Row 2, fasten off. Row 3: Attach tangerine yarn, sc in first sc, [ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, sc in next sc] rep across, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Inc, [ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, sc in next sc] 5 times, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, inc, ch 1, turn. (9 sc)

At the end of Row 4, fasten off.

Row 5: Attach mint julep
yarn, rep Row 3.

Row 6: Inc, [ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, sc in next sc] 7 times, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, inc, ch 1, turn. (11) At the end of Row 6, fasten off. Row 7: Attach eggshell yarn, rep Row 3.

Row 8: Inc, [ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, sc in next sc] 9 times, ch 1, sk ch-1 sp, inc, ch 1, turn. (13 sc)

Row 9: Rep Row 3, fasten off. With yarn needle and yarn, sew

front, back and sleeves together.

With yarn needle and length of yarn, weave around opening of sts of back bottom shaping, pull yarn ends gently to close opening, secure and fasten off. Rep on opposite side of bottom shaping.

SUIT NUMBERS

From tangerine felt, cut 4 suit numbers. Glue 2 numbers center front and center back of suit.

SHOES (MAKE 2)

SOLE

Rnd 1: With silver yarn, ch 7, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 4 chs, 3 sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next 4 chs, join. (14)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, 2 sc in each next 3 sc, sc in next sc, hdc in each next 2 sc, 3 dc in each next 5 sc, hdc in each next 2 sc, sc in next sc, join. (27)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 3 times, sc in next 21 sts, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off. (30)

Rnd 4: Attach black yarn in same sc as silver yarn was fastened off, ch 1, sc in each st around, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in next 16 sc, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] 5 times, sl st to join in beg sc. (25)

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in next 5 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next 18 sc, sl st to join in beg sc. (24)

Rnd 8: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, join, fasten off.

CLEATS (make 12)


Rnd 1: With silver yarn, ch 2, 5 sc in 2nd ch from hook, join, ch 1. (5)

Rnd 2: Sc in each sc around, join, fasten off.

- Crochet cotton size 10*:

- Steel crochet hook size 8
- · 13-inch doll*
- · 3 pearls 8mm
- ¼ yd ½-inch-wide decorative white lace
- · Seam sealant
- 4 light pink ¼-inch ribbon roses
- 1½ yds ¼-inch-wide pink satin ribbon
- · Sewing needle
- Pink and white sewing threads
- · Yarn needle

*Coats & Clark Red Heart Baby yarn, J. & P. Coats Knit-Cro-Sheen and Just For Keeps 13-inch doll by Wang's International, Inc., were used in the sample project. See Buyer's Guide, page 38, for purchasing information for doll.

GAUGE

6 sc = 1 inch; 7 sc rows = 1 inch; 3 dc rows = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTE

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

DRESS

BODICE

Row 1: Beg at waistline, with crochet hook size C and bright pink yarn, ch 49, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (48)

Rows 2-4: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

LEFT BACK

Row 5: Sc in each next 9 sc, ch 1, turn. (9)

Rows 6-15: Sc in each sc across,

ch 1, turn.

Row 16: Sc in next 6 sc, fasten off.

FRONT

Row 1 (Right side): Sk next 7 unworked sts on Row 4 for underarm, attach bright pink yarn in next st, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in next 15 sc, ch 1, turn. (16)

Rows 2-11: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 12: Sc in each next 6 sc, fasten off, sk next 4 sc, attach bright pink in next sc, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in next 5 sc, fasten off.

RIGHT BACK

Row 1 (Right side): Sk next 7 unworked sc of Row 4, attach bright pink yarn in next sc, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in next 8 sc, ch 1, turn. (9)

Rows 2-11: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 12: SI st in next 4 sc, ch 1, sc in same st as last sI st, sc in next 5 sc, fasten off.

Sew shoulder seams.

LEFT BACK OPENING

Row 1: With right side of bodice facing, attach bright pink in lower corner of left back, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, work 16 sc evenly sp up edge, ch 1, turn. (17)

Rows 2 & 3: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 3, fasten off.

RIGHT BACK OPENING

Row 1: With right side of bodice facing, attach bright pink in upper top corner of right back, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, work 16 sc evenly sp down back edge, ch 1, turn. (17)

Row 2: Sc in first sc, [ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next 6 sc] twice, ch 1, sk next sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, turn. (3 buttonholes)

Row 3: Sc in each st across, fasten off.

SLEEVES (make 2)

Rnd 1 (Right side): Attach bright pink yarn at center underarm, ch 1, sc in same at as beg ch-1, work 34 more sc ats evenly sp around, al at to join in beg sc, do not

turn rnds. (35)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in next 6 sc, hdc in next 4 sc, 2 dc in each next 15 sc, hdc in next 4 sc, sc in next 6 sc, sl st to join. (50)

Rnds 3 & 4: Ch 1, sc in next 6 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, dc in next 30 sts, hdc in next 4 sts, sc in next 6 sts, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sts] 3 times, [dec 1 hdc over next 2 sts] twice, [dec 1 dc over next 2 dc] 15 times, [dec 1 hdc over next 2 sts] twice, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] 3 times, sl st to join in beg sc. (25)

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in next 3 sts, hdc in next 2 sts, [dec 1 dc over next 2 sts] 7 times, dc in next st, hdc in next 2 sts, sc in next 3 sts, sl st to join in beg sc. (18)

Rnds 7-25: Sc in each st around, sl st to join in beg sc.

At the end of Rnd 25, fasten off.

SKIRT

Rnd 1: Lap right back opening edge over left back opening edge, attach bright pink yarn through both thicknesses in bottom corner of right back edge, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, sc in next 2 sts, sc in each next 48 chains of opposite side of foundation ch, sl st to join, do not turn rnds. (51)

Rnd 2: Working in back lps for this rnd only, ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, work 2 dc in each st around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (102)

Rnds 3-16: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 17: Ch 3, work 2 dc in same dc as beg ch-3, work 3 dc in each rem dc around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (306)

Rnds 18 & 19: Ch 3, dc in each dc around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

At the end of Rnd 19, fasten off.

LACE COLLAR

Row 1: With steel crochet hook size 8, sk left back opening placket row, attach white crochet cotton in next st of neckline edge, ch 1, work 55 sc sts evenly sp around neckline edge to within right back placket, ch 1, turn. (55)

Row 2: Working in back lps for

this row only, so in first st, [ch 5, sk next 2 sts, so in next st] rep across, ending with ch 5, so in last st, ch 3, turn.

Row 3: Work 2 dc, ch 1 and 2 dc in center of each ch-5 lp across, ending with dc in last st, fasten off.

LACE OVERSKIRT

Row 1: Working in rem free lps of Row 1 of skirt, find center front lp, with steel crochet hook size 8, attach white crochet cotton in next st (skipping center front st), ch 1, sc in same st, [ch 8, sk next st, sc in next st] rep around, leaving center front lp free, ch 5, turn. (25 ch-8 lps)

Row 2: *Work 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc in center of ch-8 lp, ch 2, dc in next sc, ch 2, rep from * around, ending with ch 2, dc in last sc, ch 5, turn.

Row 3: *Work 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc in ch-2 sp of shell, ch 2, dc in single dc between shells, ch 2, rep from * across, ending with ch 2, dc in 3rd ch of turning ch-5, ch 5, turn.

Rows 4-11: Rep Row 3.

At the end of Row 11, ch 1, turn.

Row 12: SI st in last dc worked on previous row, *ch 1, 8 dc in ch-2 sp of shell, ch 1, sI st in single dc between shells, rep from * across, ending with ch 1, sI st in 3rd ch of turning ch-5, fasten off.

FINISHING

Lap right placket over left placket. Mark positions of buttonholes. Sew pearls to left placket at marked positions.

From lace, cut 2 pieces long enough to reach from neck to waistline on center front of bodice, 2 pieces long enough to reach around bottom of each sleeve with a slight overlap and 2 pieces long enough to reach around sleeves just under puffed section with a slight overlap. Seal end of trim with drop of seam sealant. Allow to dry completely.

Sew trim down center front of bodice allowing %-inch sp at center between lace strips. Sew lace to bottom of each sleeve and just under puffed section.

Tack a ribbon rose to bodice front through center front of collar. Cut a 24-inch length of pink

satin ribbon. Match center of ribbon to center front of bodice. With sewing needle and thread, whipstitch bottom edge of ribbon to center front only. Tie ribbon ends in a bow at center back.

BONNET

Rnd 1 (Right side): With crochet hook size C and bright pink yarn, ch 2, 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sl st to join, ch 1, do not turn rnds.

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around, join, ch 1. (14)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, join, ch 1. (21)

Rnd 4: [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, join, ch 1. (28)

Rnd 5: [Se in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, join, ch 1. (35)

Rnd 6: Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, dc in next 2 sc, 2 dc in next sc, dc in next 2 sc, sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next st, 2 sc in next st, sc in next 5 sts, dc in next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st, sc in last 5 sts, join, ch 1.

Rnd 7: Sc in next 5 sts, dc in next 4 sts, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 4 sts, sc in next 11 sts, dc in next 4 sts, 2 dc in each of next 2 sts, dc in next 4 sts, sc in next 5 sts, join, ch 1.

Rnd 8: Sc in next 10 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, sc in next 21 sts, ch 2, sk next 2 sts, sc in next 10 sts, join, ch 1.

Rnd 9: Sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next 4 sts, sc in next 4 sts, sc in next 2 sts, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next 9 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next 4 sts, sc in next 2 chs, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in each of next 2 sts, sc in next 4 sts, join, ch 3.

Rnd 10: Working in back lps for this rnd only, 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, work 3 dc in each st around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

Rnd 11: With steel crochet hook size 8, attach white crochet cotton in any dc of Rnd 10, ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, [ch 3, sl st in first ch, sc in next st] rep around, ending with ch 3, sl st in first ch, join in beg sc, fasten off.

FINISHING

Cut a 20-inch piece of pink satin ribbon. Thread ribbon from wrong side through 1 slit opening at side of bonnet, across top on right side and down through opposite slit to wrong side.

Sew 3 ribbon roses evenly sp across front of bonnet just behind ruffle. *

- 3 yds cotton clothesline
- · Fiberfill
- Sharp yarn needle

GAUGE

4 sc = 1 inch; 4 sc rows = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Do not join rnds unless otherwise indicated. Use a scrap of CC yarn to mark rnds.

BODY (make 2)

Row 1: With black yarn, ch 20, hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, turn. (19)

Rows 2-12: Ch 2, hdc in each hdc across, turn.

At the end of Row 12, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Attach animal noise box, centered, over Row 5.

With sharp yarn needle and length of black yarn, place cut end of clothesline at side edge of Row 12, whipstitch clothesline to body down edge to Row 1. Sew beg and ending of Rows 1-12 together, weave yarn through opposite side of foundation ch, pull tightly to close, secure and fasten off. Stuff body with fiberfill.

HEAD (make 2)

Rnd 1: With black yarn, ch 3, 8 hdc in first ch of ch-3, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (9)

Rnd 2: Ch 2, hdc in same st as beg ch-2, work 2 hdc in each rem st around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2. (18)

Rnd 3: Ch 2, 2 hdc in next st, [1 hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2. (27)

Rnd 4: Ch 2, hdc in next st, 2 hdc in next st, [hdc in each next 2 sts, 2 hdc in next st] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2. (36)

Rnds 5-8: Ch 2, hdc in each st around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2.

Rnd 9: Ch 2, hdc in next st, dec 1 hdc over next 2 sts, [hdc in each next 2 sts, dec 1 hdc over next 2 sts] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2. (27)

Rnd 10: Ch 2, dec 1 hdc over next 2 sts, [hdc in next st, dec 1 hdc over next 2 sts] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (18)

Stuff head with fiberfill, with rem length of yarn, sew Rnd 10 of head to top of body.

Nose (make 2)

Rnd 1: With white yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around. (12)

Rnd 3: [2 sc in each next 3 sts, sc in each next 3 sts] twice. (18)

Rnd 4: Sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in each next 3 sts, sc in each next 6 sts, 2 sc in each next 3 sts, sc in next 4 sts. (24)

Rnds 5-8: Sc in each st around.

Rnd 9: Sc in next 3 sts, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sts] twice, sc in next 8 sts, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sts] twice, sc in next 5 sts, sl st in next st, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (20)

For nostrils, with yarn needle next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (4)

and length of black yarn, make 2 straight vertical sts over Rnd 3, each approximately 1/4 inch long.

Stuff nose with fiberfill and sew over last 5 rnds of head.

Head piece (make 2)

Row 1: With white yarn, ch 5, 2 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next 2 chs, 2 sc in last ch, ch 1, turn. (6)

Row 2: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each next 4 sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (8)

Rows 3-6: Se in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 7: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in each next 4 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (6)

Row 8: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (4)

Row 9: [Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] twice, ch 1, turn. (2)

Rows 10-17: Sc in each next 2 sc, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 17, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Leaving 3 sc sts free between eyes, attach eyes to Row 2 of head piece.

With Row 1 touching nose, sew head piece to face.

HORNS (make 4)

Rnd 1: With tan yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnds 2-6: Sc in each sc around.

At the end of Rnd 6, sl st in next st, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. Stuff horns lightly with fiberfill. Sew horns to top of head over black section at each side of white head piece.

EAR FRONTS (make 4)

Row 1: With pink yarn, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (4)

Row 2: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 3: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each next 2 sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (6)

Rows 4 & 5: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 6: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in each next 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (4) Row 7: [Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] twice, fasten off. (2)

EAR BACKS (make 4)

Rows 1-7: With black yarn, rep Rows 1-7 of ear fronts.

Rnd 8: Holding 1 each pink and black ear together (pink section facing), working through both thicknesses, attach black in opposite side of foundation ch, ch 1, sc evenly sp around entire outer edge of ear, sl st to join in beg sc, fold the 4 sc sts worked across opposite side of foundation ch in half, sl st across, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Sew ears to each side of head below horns. *

FOOTBALL

SIDE SECTIONS (make 4)

Row 1: With wood brown yarn, ch 2, 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, turn. (1)

Row 2: Work 3 sc in the 1 sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Row 3: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Work 2 sc in first sc, 1 sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, ch 1, turn. (5)

Rows 5-7: Rep Row 3.

Row 8: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Row 9: Rep Row 3.

Row 10: Draw up a lp in each of next 3 sc, yo, draw through all 3 lps on hook, ch 1, turn. (3)


Row 11: Sc in sc, fasten off. (1)

Note: On 1 side section on Row 6, sc in first sc, working over elastic, sc in next 3 sc, sc in next sc, ch 1, turn.

Sew all 4 pieces together, stuffing with fiberfill before closing.

With a length of eggshell yarn and yarn needle, embroider 4 crossstitches across a center seam opposite elastic band. Embroider down center of 4 cross-stitches.

Place elastic band over hand. *



Embroidery

Using black yarn and tapestry needle, embroider 3 straight-stitch X's, centered on the front over

BACK

Rows 1-24: Rep Rows 1-24 of front.

Rnd 25: Rep Rnd 25 of front, do not fasten off.

Do not embroider on back.

JOINING

Holding front and back together, with wrong sides together, working in back lps only through both thicknesses, sl st in each st around changing colors as colors change on piece, stuffing with fiberfill before closing.

FINISHING

Cut 101/4-inch length of lace for each jar. Sew entirely around Row 16 of jar, folding 1 end of lace under and overlapping ends at center back.

Note: Use purple ribbon for lavender jar, gold ribbon for honey

- · 2 barrettes each 3 inches

GAUGE

Work evenly and consistently

PATTERN NOTE

Materials listed will make 2 barrettes.

BARRETTES

Rnd 1: Attach crochet cotton to ring, ch 1, work 48 sc over ring, sl st to join in beg sc. (48)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, ch 3, sk 1 sc, [sc in next sc, ch 3, sk 1 sc] rep around, al st to join in beg sc. (24 ch lps)

Rnd 3: SI st into next ch lp, ch 1, sc in same ch-3 lp, 3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc in next ch-3 lp, [sc in next ch-3 lp, 3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc in next ch-3 lp] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

Glue ribbon to top of barrette.

Cut fabric to fit top and sides of electronic music box. With care, place a small amount of glue on sides of electronic music box. Secure fabric to music box. Trim any excess fabric from music box.

Slip crocheted ring over edge of music box.

Place glue on back of barrette across ribbon, press music box and crocheted section that touches barrette onto barrette. Allow to dry completely. *

Fall Leaf Earrings

DIRECTIONS

Easy

SIZE

11/2 inches long

MATERIALS

- Crochet cotton size 10;
 3 yds khaki green
 4 yds deep coral
- · Steel crochet hook size 11
- · 2 earring backs
- Fabric stiffener

GAUGE

Work evenly and consistently

PATTERN NOTE

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

LEAVES (make 2)

Rnd 1 (Right side): With khaki green crochet cotton, ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 hdc in next ch, hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, sc, ch 2 and sc in last ch, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, 2 hdc in next ch, sc in next ch, sl st to join in beg sc, ch 1.

Rnd 2 (Right side): Sc in each st around, working sc, ch 3 and sc in ch-2 sp, ch 1, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off. (14 sc plus 1 ch-3 sp)

Rnd 3 (Right side): Draw up a lp of deep coral crochet cotton in first sc, [ch 3, sl st in next sc] 6 times, ch 3, sl st, ch 5 and sl st in ch-3 sp, [ch 3, sl st in next sc] 7 times, sl st in ch-1 sp, ch 9, sl st in same ch-1 sp, sl st to join in beg sl st, fasten off.

FINISHING

Dip leaves in fabric stiffener, place on a flat surface and allow to dry completely.

Attach each leaf to earring back through ch-9 loop. *

Western Button Covers

DIRECTIONS

Easy

SIZE

134 inches in diameter

MATERIALS

- Crochet cotton size 10:
 Small amount light blue
- 8 silver 3mm beads each button
- Silver 4mm bead each button
- %-inch button cover each button
- Sewing needle and matching thread
- · Fabric stiffener
- · Hot-glue gun

GAUGE

Rnds 1 and 2 = 1 inch

CROCHETED COVER

Rnd 1: Ch 4, 11 dc in first ch, sl st to join in top of beg ch. (12)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, work 2 dc in each rem dc around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (24)

Rnd 3: Ch 4 (first dc, ch 1), dc in next dc, ch 1] 23 times, sl st to join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4.

SCALLOPED EDGING

Rnd 4: SI st into next ch-1 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-1 sp, ch 3, sc in same ch-1 sp, [sc, ch 3 and sc in next ch-1 sp] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

Weave in loose end.

PLAIN EDGE

Rnd 4: Sl st in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 sc in same ch-1 sp, work 3 sc in each ch-1 sp around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off. Weave in loose end.

FINISHING

Saturate covers with fabric stiffener. Place on a flat surface and allow to dry completely.

With sewing needle and thread, sew 1 silver 4mm bead to center of Rnd 1, sew 8 silver 3mm beads evenly spaced around Rnd 2.

Glue crocheted piece centered to button cover. *

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, [dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc in next dc] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (30)

Rnds 4-7: Ch 3, dc in each st around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Note: If body is worked in 2 colors, fasten off first color, attach 2nd color.

Rnd 8: Ch 4 (first dc, ch 1), sk next st, [dc in next st, ch 1, sk 1 st] rep around, sl st to join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4. (15 ch-1 sps)

Rnd 9: Ch 3 (first dc), dc in next ch-1 sp, [dc in next dc, dc in next ch-1 sp] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (30)

Rnds 10-12: Ch 3, dc in each st around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. At the end of Rnd 12, fasten off.

PUMPKIN

BODY

With orange crochet cotton, rep Basic Body Rnds 1-12.

HAT

Rnd 1: With black crochet cotton, ch 5, 19 tr in 5th ch from hook, al st to join in top of beg ch. (20)

Rnds 2 & 3: Ch 3, dc in each st around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (20)

Rnd 4: Ch 3 (first dc), dc in same st as beg ch-3, work 2 dc in each st around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off. (40)

FACIAL FEATURES

For eyes and nose, cut 3 triangles and for mouth, cut 1 crescent from black felt. Glue to head.

FINISHING

Glue hat to top of head. Weave a

9-inch length of black ribbon through ch-1 sps of Rnd 8, tie ends in a bow at center front.

GHOST

BODY

With white crochet cotton, rep Basic Body Rnds 1-12.

FACIAL FEATURES

From black felt, for eyes, cut 2 circles; cut 1 crescent for mouth. Glue facial features to head.

FINISHING

Weave a 9-inch length of orange ribbon through ch-1 sps of Rnd 8, tie ends in a bow at center front.

WITCH

BODY

Rnds 1-7: With hunters green crochet cotton, rep Rnds 1-7 of Basic Body. At the end of Rnd 7, fasten off hunters green.

Rnds 8-12: With black crochet cotton, rep Rnds 8-12 of Basic Body.

HAT

Rnd 1: With black crochet cotton, ch 20, join to form a ring, ch 3 (first dc), dc in each rem ch around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (20)

Rnds 2-4: Ch 3 (first dc), [dc in next dc, dec 1 dc over next 2 dc] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

At the end of Rnd 4, to close top, make 1 sl st in top of hat, fasten off.

Rnd 5: Attach black crochet cotton in opposite side of foundation ch, ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, work 2 dc in each ch around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (40)

Rnd 6: Ch 3, dc in next st, 2 dc in next st, [dc in each next 2 sts, 2 dc in next st] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

NOSE

With hunters green crochet cotton and leaving a 6-inch length of cotton at beg, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, 2 sc in next ch, hdc in next ch, dc in next ch, fasten off.

With 6-inch length of cotton, sew nose to center of Rnd 5.

FACIAL FEATURES

For eyes, cut 2 circles and for mouth, cut I crescent from black felt. Glue facial features to head.

HAIR

With orange crochet cotton, cut several 4-inch-long strands. Working in lark's head, attach orange strands to top and sides of Rnds 1 and 2. Trim to desired length.

FINISHING

Glue hat to top of head.

Weave a 9-inch length of black ribbon through ch-1 sps of Rnd 8, tie ends in a bow at center front.

SCARECROW

BODY

Rnds 1-7: With cream crochet cotton, rep Rnds 1-7 of Basic Body.

At the end of Rnd 7, fasten off cream cotton.

Rnds 8-12: With hunters green crochet cotton, rep Rnds 8-12 of Basic Body.

HAT

Rnd 1: With purple crochet cotton, ch 30, join to form a ring, ch 3, dc in each ch around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (30)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dec 1 dc over next 2 dc, [dc in next dc, dec 1 dc over next 2 dc] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (20)

Rnd 3: Ch 3, dec 1 dc over next 2 dc, [dc in next dc, dec 1 dc over next 2 dc] 5 times, dc in each next 2 dc, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (14)

Row 4: Fold Rnd 3 flat across, working through both thicknesses, al st top opening closed, fasten off.

Rnd 5: Attach purple crochet cotton in opposite side of foundation ch, ch 4, tr in same st as beg ch-4, work 2 tr in each ch around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-4, fasten off.

HAIR

With orange crochet cotton, cut several 2-inch-long strands. Working in lark's head, attach to top and sides of head to cover.

FINISHING

Glue hat to top of head.

Weave a 9-inch length of red ribbon through ch-1 sps of Rnd 8, tie ends in a bow at center front.

BLACK CAT

BODY

With black crochet cotton, rep Rnds 1-12 of Basic Body. EARS (make 2)

Row 1: With black crochet cotton, leaving a 6-inch length at beginning, ch 7, dc in 4th ch from hook, dc in each next 3 chs, turn. (5)

Row 2: Ch 1, draw up a lp in each st across, yo, draw through all lps on hook, fasten off.

WHISKERS

Cut 3 strands of black crochet cotton each 6 inches long.

knot all strands together at center. Saturate whiskers with fabric stiffener. Place on a flat surface, separate whiskers and allow to dry completely.

FACIAL FEATURES

For eyes, cut 2 circles, and for nose, cut 1 triangle from orange felt.

FINISHING

Sew ears to top of head. Glue Holding all 3 strands together, | eyes to face. Glue whiskers to cen-

ter of face, trim whiskers as desired. Glue nose over center of whiskers. With sewing needle and black crochet cotton, make 1 vertical stitch in the center of each eye. Cut a 9-inch length of orange ribbon, weave through ch-1 sps of Rnd 8, tie ends in a bow at center front. *

Row 3: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each next 2 sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (7)

Rows 4-11: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 11, draw up a lp of white yarn, fasten off lavender yarn, ch 1, turn.

Rows 12-14: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 15: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next 3 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (5)

Row 16: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc. sc in next sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Rnd 17: Working in ends of rows and in each sc, sc around entire outer edge of jar, changing colors as colors change on piece and making 2 sc in lower corners, sl st to join, fasten off.

Embroidery

Using black yarn and tapestry needle, embroider 3 straight-stitch | X's, centered on front over Rows 5 and 6.

PLASTIC CANVAS

Using front as pattern, cut plastic canvas slightly smaller than jar front.

BACK

Rows 1-16: Rep Rows 1-16 of front.

Rnd 17: Rep Rnd 17 of front. Do not embroider on back.

JOINING

Holding front and back together, with wrong sides together, working in back lps only through both thicknesses, sl st in each st around changing colors as colors change on piece, inserting plastic canvas before closing, al st to join, fasten off.

FINISHING

Cut 61/2 inches of lace, sew around jar over Row 12, folding 1 end under and overlapping end at center back. Glue magnet over ribbon at center back.

POT HOLDER

FRONT

Row 1: With country red yarn, ch 14, se in 2nd ch from hook, se in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (13)

Rows 2-4: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to within last sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (19)

Rows 5-33: Sc in each sc across. ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 33, draw up a lp of white yarn, fasten off country red yarn, ch 1, turn.

Rows 34-43: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn. (19)

Rows 44-47: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in each sc across to within last 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (11)

Rnd 48: Working in ends of rows and in each sc, sc around entire outer edge of jar, changing yarn color as colors change, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

EMBROIDERY

Using black yarn and tapestry needle, embroider 3 straight-stitch Xs, centered over Rows 16-19.

BACK

Rows 1-47: Rep Rows 1-47 of front.

Rnd 48: Rep Rnd 48 of front, do not fasten off.

JOINING

Holding front and back together with wrong sides together, working through both thicknesses in back lps only, sl st in each st around, sl st to join, fasten off.

Do not stuff pot holder with fiberfill.

FINISHING

Cut 2 pieces of lace each 121/4 inches. Sew first piece around jar over Row 32, overlapping ends at center back. Sew 2nd piece around jar over Row 34 over first piece of lace, overlapping ends at center back.

For hanger, sew plastic ring centered on back over Row 43. *

Twin-Cable Cardigan

DIRECTIONS

Intermediate

SIZE

Small, 10–12 (medium, 14–16, and large, 18–20) Finished measurements: 40 (44-48) inches

MATERIALS

- Crochet cotton size 10 in 50-gram balls*: 12 (14-16) balls No 517 coral 6 (6-7) balls No 523 dusty rose
- Crochet hooks sizes
 E/4 and F/5
- · 8 white %-inch buttons
- Sewing needle and thread
- · Yarn needle

*Coats Opera crochet cotton was used in the sample project.

GAUGE

With crochet hook size F, 4 hdc = 1 inch; 5 hdc rows = 1½ inches

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Work with 2 strands of crochet cotton held together throughout.

BACK

Row 1: With crochet hook size F and 2 strands of coral crochet cotton held together, ch 81 (89-97), hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (80-88-96)

Row 2: Hdc in each hdc across, ch 1, turn.

Rep Row 2 until piece measures 16 inches. Change to 2 strands of dusty rose, place markers at each edge to mark underarm.

Rep Row 2 for 7 (8-9) inches.

Shoulder shaping

Row 1: Hdc across 26 (28-30) hdc sts, ch 1, turn.

Rep Row 1 for 1 inch. Fasten off. Sk center 28 (32-36) sts, attach 2 strands of dusty rose crochet cotton in next st, ch 1, hdc in same st as beg ch-1, hdc in each next 25 (27-29) sts, ch 1, turn. (26-28-30)

Hdc in each hdc across until shoulder shaping measures 1 inch, fasten off.

LEFT FRONT

Row 1: With crochet hook size F and 2 strands of coral crochet cotton held together, ch 37 (41-45) hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (36-40-44)

Row 2: Hdc in next 14 (16-18) sts, [sk next 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, fpdc around 2 skipped sts] twice, hdc in next 14 (16-18) sts, ch 1, turn.

Row 3: Hdc in next 14 (16-18) sts, bpdc around next 8 sts, hdc in next 14 (16-18) sts, ch 1, turn.

Rep Rows 2 and 3 until piece measures 16 inches, place marker for underarm, changing to 2 strands of dusty rose crochet cotton, fasten off coral crochet cotton.

With dusty rose crochet cotton, continue in pattern of Rows 2 and 3 until piece measures 5 (6-7) inches from underarm, ending on wrong side.

Neckline shaping

Row 1: Hdc in next 14 (16-18) sts, [sk next 2 sts, fpdc around next 2 sts, fpdc around skipped sts] twice, hdc across to within last 5 (6-7) hdc sts at neckline edge unworked, ch 1, turn. (31-34-37)

Working in pattern, decrease 1 hdc at neckline edge every row 5 (6-7) times, working even until piece measures 7 (8-9) inches from underarm. (26-28-30)

Shoulder shaping

Work even in pattern on 26 (28-30) sts for 1 inch. Fasten off.

RIGHT FRONT

Rep left front to within neckline shaping, ending on wrong side, fasten off, turn. (36-40-44)

Neckline shaping

Sk first 5 (6-7) sts, attach 2 strands dusty rose crochet cotton in next hdc, ch 1, hdc in same st as beg ch-1, work in pattern across, ch 1, turn.

Working in pattern, decrease 1 hdc at neckline edge every row 5 (6-7) times, working even until piece measures 7 (8-9) inches from underarm. (26-28-30)

Shoulder shaping

Work even in pattern on 26 (28-30) sts for 1 inch. Fasten off.

SLEEVES (make 2)


Note: Sleeves are worked from lower edge upward.

Row 1: With crochet hook size F and 2 strands of coral crochet cotton held together, ch 65 (73-81), hdc in 2nd ch from hook, hdc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (64-72-80)

Row 1: With daffodil yellow yarn, ch 56 (60-66-70), sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (55-59-65-69)

Row 2: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1] rep across to within last sc, sc in last sc, ch 1, turn.

Row 3 (Pattern row): Dec 1 sc over first sc and next ch-1 sp, ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next sc and next ch-1 sp] rep across, ending with sc in last sc, ch 1, turn.

Rows 4-9 (11-14-17): Rep Row 3.

Rows 3-30: Rep Row 2.

Row 31: Sl st across first 4 (6-6-6) sts, ch 1, sc in next 0 (0-3-5) sts, work 47 sc sts of graph section, sc in next 0 (0-3-5) sc sts, ch 1, turn. (47-47-53-57)

Rows 32-37: Sc in next 0 (0-3-5) sc sts, work 47 sc sts of graph section, sc in next 0 (0-3-5) sc sts, ch 1, turn.

Row 38: With daffodil yellow yarn, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1] rep across to within last sc, sc in last sc, ch 1, turn.

[Rep Row 3 pattern row] 3 (6-8-10) times.

First neck shaping

Rows 1-4: [Dec 1 sc over next sc and next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 4 (4-4-5) times, sc in next sc, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 4, fasten off.

Second neck shaping

Row 1: Attach daffodil yarn in 9th (9th-9th-11th) at from opposite shoulder edge of front, ch 1, dec 1 sc over same sc as beg ch-1 and next ch-1 sp, ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next sc and next ch-1 sp] 3 (3-3-4) times, ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-4: [Dec 1 sc over next sc and next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 4 (4-4-5) times, sc in next sc, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 4, fasten off.

Note: Total number of rows on front including neck shaping is 54 (59-64-69).

BACK

Row 1: With daffodil yellow yarn, ch 56 (60-66-70), sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn.

Row 2: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1] rep across to within last sc, sc in last sc, ch 1, turn.

Row 3 (Pattern row): Dec 1 sc over first sc and next ch-1 sp, [dec 1 sc over next sc and next ch-1 sp] rep across to within last sc, sc in last sc, ch 1, turn.

Rows 4-39 (41-44-47): Rep Row 3. Row 40 (42-45-48): SI st across first 4 (6-6-6) sts, ch 1, work in pattern across to within last 4 (6-6-6) sts, ch 1, turn. (47-47-53-57)

Rows 41-50 (43-55, 46-60, 49-65): Rep Row 3 pattern row.

First neck shaping

Rows 1-4: Rep Rows 1-4 of front first neck shaping.

Second neck shaping

Rows 1-4: Rep Rows 1-4 of front 2nd neck shaping.

Note: Total number of rows on back including neck shaping is 54 (59-64-69).

SLEEVES (make 2)

Note: Make 1 sleeve with colored stripes and the other without or both with the colored stripes.

Row 1: With daffodil yellow yarn, ch 40 (42-46-48), sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (39-41-45-47)

Row 2: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1] rep across to within last sc, sc in last sc, ch 1, turn.

Rows 3-9 (11-13-15): Rep Row

3 pattern row.

Row 10 (12-14-16) (Inc row): Sc, ch 1 and sc in first sc, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, [dec 1 sc over next sc and next ch-1 sp, ch 1] rep across to within last sc, sc, ch 1 and sc in last sc, ch 1, turn.

Rows 11-19 (13-23, 15-27, 17-31): Rep Row 3 pattern row.

Row 20 (24-28-32): Sc, ch 1 and sc in first sc, ch 1, sk next ch-1 sp, [dec 1 sc over next sc and next ch-1 sp, ch 1] rep across to within last sc, sc, ch 1 and sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. [Rep Row 3 pattern row] 3 times all sizes.

At the end of last rep, fasten off.

[With emerald green yarn, rep Row 3 pattern row] 3 (3-4-4) times.

At the end of last rep, fasten off.

[With jockey red yarn, rep Row 3 pattern row] 3 (3-4-4) times.

At the end of last rep, fasten off. [With daffodil yellow yarn, rep. Row 3 pattern row] 6 (9-9-9) times. At the end of last rep, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Press pieces and block.

Sew shoulder seams. Pin each sleeve into armhole opening, easing in fullness, sew each sleeve in armhole opening.

Sew side and sleeve seams.

NECKLINE RIBBING

Rnd 1 (Wrong side): With crochet hook size E, attach jockey red ribbing.

yarn at center back neckline, ch 2, hdc evenly sp around neckline opening, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2, turn.

Rnd 2 (Right side): Ch 3, [fpdc around next hdc, bpdc around next hdc] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 3 (Right side): Ch 3, [fpdc around fpdc, bpdc around bpdc] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 4: Ch 1, [fpsc around fpdc, bpsc around bpdc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

SLEEVE RIBBING

Rnd 1 (Wrong side): With crochet hook size E, attach jockey red in sleeve seam, ch 2, hdc evenly sp around sleeve, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2, turn.

Rnd 2: Rep Rnd 2 of neckline ribbing.

Rnds 3-7: Rep Rnd 3 of neckline ribbing.

Rnd 8: Rep Rnd 4 of neckline ribbing.

BOTTOM RIBBING

Rnd 1 (Wrong side): With crochet hook size E, attach jockey red yarn in side seam, ch 2, hdc evenly sp around bottom of sweater, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2, turn.

Rnd 2: Rep Rnd 2 of neckline ribbing.



- Crochet hooks sizes F/5 (E/4-G/6)
- · Yarn needle

*Coats & Clark Red Heart sport weight yarn was used in the sample project.

GAUGE

Small motif: 2¼ inches for size small Large motif: 2% inches for size medium Large motif: 3 inches for size large

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

For size small, make small motif

with crochet hook size F. For medium, make large motif with crochet hook size E. For large, make large motif with crochet hook size G.

Color combinations include jockey red with Wedgwood blue and maize with paddy green.

SMALL TRIANGLE MOTIF

Note: Make 3 of each color combination.

Row 1: With crochet hook size F and maize (jockey red) yarn, ch 4, work 2 dc, ch 2 and 3 dc in 4th ch from hook changing to paddy green (Wedgwood blue) yarn on last dc, ch 3, turn.

Row 2: Work 3 dc in same place

changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, in next lp work 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, 4 dc in last dc, fasten off.

SMALL HALF-MOTIF

Note: Make 1 of each color combination.

Row 1: With crochet hook size F and maize (jockey red) yarn, ch 6, work 2 dc, ch 2 and dc in 6th ch from hook, ch 2, turn.

Row 2: Dc in same place changing colors, in next lp work 3 dc, ch 2 and 3 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, in next lp work 3 dc, ch 2 and 3 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in last dc, fasten off.


LARGE MOTIF

Note: Make 21 of each color combination.

Rnd 1: With maize (jockey red) yarn, ch 2, work 12 sc in 2nd ch from hook, al st in beg sc to join.

Rnd 2: Working over paddy green (Wedgwood blue) yarn, with maize, ch 3, work a dc in next sc until the point where 2 lps rem on hook, to change to paddy green, yo with paddy green, dropping old color to back of work and draw through both lps on hook *working over color not in use throughout, in next sc work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc changing to maize on last dc as before, dc in next 2 sc changing to paddy green on last dc, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 3: With maize yarn, ch 3, dc in next dc changing to paddy



green, "dc in next 2 dc, in next ch-2 sp work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc changing to maize yarn on last dc, dc in next 2 dc changing to paddy green on last dc, rep from " around, join, fasten off.

LARGE TRIANGLE MOTIF

Note: Make 3 of each color combination.

Row 1: With maize yarn, ch 2, work 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook changing to paddy green on last sc, ch 3, turn.

Row 2: Work 2 dc in same place changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 sc changing colors on last dc, in next sc work 2 dc, ch 2 and 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 sc changing colors on last dc, 3 dc in last sc, ch 3, turn.

Row 3: 2 dc in same place, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 dc, in next sp work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 dc, 3 dc in last dc, fasten off.

LARGE HALF-MOTIF

Note: Make 1 of each color combination.

Row 1: With maize yarn, ch 2, work 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook, ch 2, turn.

Row 2: Dc in same place changing colors in next sc work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 sc changing colors on last dc, in next sc work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in last sc, ch 2, turn.

Row 3: Dc in same place changing colors, dc in next 2 dc, in next space work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on first dc, dc in next 2 dc, in next sp work 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc, dc in next 2 dc changing colors on last dc, dc in last dc, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

With yarn needle and length of Wedgwood blue yarn, following diagram, sew blocks together. Sew shoulder seams.

EDGING

Rnd 1 (Right side): With cro-

chet hook according to size of vest, attach paddy green varn to bottom edge at side seam, ch 1, sc in same place, sc across, working 10 sc across each small motif or 12 sc across each large motif to bottom corner, work 3 sc in corner sp, continue in same manner up front opening edge to corner of front neck shaping, work 2 sc in corner, work 11 sc evenly sp across small triangle motif and 14 sc evenly sp across large triangle motif, continue up shoulder and around back of neck working 10 sc evenly sp across small half-motif or 12 sc evenly sp across large half-motif, decreasing 1 sc at each inside corner at back of neck, continue similarly around, join, fasten off.

Rnd 2: Attach Wedgwood blue yarn, sc in each sc around, working 3 sc at each bottom corner and 2 sc at each corner on front neck shaping, sl st to join, fasten off.

ARMHOLE EDGING

Rnds 1 & 2: Attach yarn at underarm, rep in same manner as for Rnds 1 and 2 of edging. *

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Graph-reading knowledge is necessary.

Main body of sweater is crocheted with crochet hook size G. All ribbings are crocheted with crochet hook size E.

To change colors: Work as for hdc until 3 lps rem on hook, drop old color, yo with new color and complete hdc, bring old color up over new color, ch 2 with new color and turn. Carry yarn not in use loosely up side of rows. Fasten off old color for long blocks of color.

Decrease 1 hdc at end of row: Work

row until 2 sts rem, then [yo, insert hook in next st, draw up a lp] twice, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook, yo, draw through rem 3 lps on hook.

Decrease 1 hdc at beg of row: Yo, insert hook in first st, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook, yo, insert hook in next st and draw up a lp, yo, draw through all 4 lps on hook. Follow graphs as a guideline on specific rows to work popcorn stitches into pattern.

Popcorn st (pc st): Work 4 dc in st, drop lp from hook, insert hook from front to back in first dc of 4-dc group, pick up dropped lp and draw through dc on hook, ch 1 to secure. Popcorn st will appear on right side of row.

For wrong-side-rows popcorn st, work 4 dc in st, drop lp from hook, insert hook from back to front in first dc of 4-dc group, pick up dropped lp and draw through dc on hook, ch 1 to secure.

GAUGE

With crochet hook size E, 5 sc = 1 inch With crochet hook size G, 4 hdc = 1 inch; 3 hdc rows = 1 inch

BACK

Ribbing

Row 1: With crochet hook size E and crystal pink yarn, ch 8, sc in 2nd ch from book, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (7)

Rows 2-56 (60-66): Working in back lps only, sc in each st across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of last rep, ch 1, do not turn.

Base row

Note: Base row will be the

right side of sweater.

Working across long edge of ribbing rows with crochet hook size G, sc in end of last row worked and in each rem row across until last row. work as for sc in last row until 2 lps rem on hook, drop old color, yo with white yarn, bring old color up over new color, ch 2 with new color, turn. (56-60-66)

Notes: Ch 2, turn after each row unless otherwise indicated.

Ch 2 turning ch does not count as a hdc. Do not work in ch-2 turning ch.

Row I: Hdc in first st and each st across, ch 2, turn.

Rows 2-44 (48-52); Hdc in each hdc across working 1 more row white, 2 rows crystal pink, 11 (15rows white, 2 rows crystal pink, 2 rows white, 2 rows crystal pink, 2 rows white, 11 rows crystal pink, 2 rows white, 2 rows crystal pink, 2 rows white, 2 rows crystal pink, fasten off crystal pink after last row and 2 rows white.

Note: Change color on last st of previous row.

Neck shaping

Row 45 (49-53): With white yarn, hdc in first hdc, hdc in next 14 (15-17) hdc, dec 1 hdc over next 2 hdc, ch 2, turn. (16-17-19)

Row 46 (50-54): Dec 1 hdc over first 2 sts, hdc in each rem hdc across, fasten off. (15-16-18)

To work opposite side, with wrong side of Row 44 (48-52) facing, sk next 22 (24-26) hdc, attach yarn to next st, work same as for opposite side, decreasing 1 st at neck edge each row.

FRONTS (make 2) Ribbing

Work 26 (28-31) rows of ribbing same as for back ribbing.

Base row

Rows 1-17 (19-21): Work even in stripe pattern same as for back throughout.

Neck shaping

Row 18 (20-22): Dec 1 hdc at beg of row (neck edge). (25-27-30)

Note: Work 1 decrease at neck edge for a decrease row.

Rows 19–38 (21–42, 23–46): Alternate I even row with I decrease row, following graph for placement of popcorn stitches. (15-16-18 hdc at end of last repeat)

Rows 39-46 (43-50, 47-54): Work even in pattern. Fasten off at the end of last repeat.

Work other half of front in same manner, reversing shaping.

SLEEVES (make 2) Ribbing

Work 26 (28-30) rows of ribbing same as for back.

Base row

Work same as for back, increasing 10 sc evenly sp across. (36-38-40).

Rows 1-4: Work even in stripe pattern same as for back. Fasten off crystal pink after Row 4.

Note: Work remainder of sleeve with white yarn.

Rows 5-8: Hde in each hde across.

Row 9: Work 2 hdc in first hdc. hde in each hde across to within last hde, 2 hde in last hde. (38-40-42)

Rows 10-33 (36-39): Alternate 2 even rows with 1 increase row. (54-58-62 hdc after last repeat)

Row 34 (37-40): Rep Row 9, fasten off. (56-60-64)

Sew shoulder seams.

NECKLINE & FRONT RIBBING

Row 1 (Right side): With crochet hook size E, attach crystal pink yarn to right bottom front edge at first st on last ribbing row. ch 7, se in 2nd ch from hook, se in next 5 chs, sl st in each next 2 sc on edge of bottom front ribbing, turn.

Note: Work in back lps only throughout neckline and front ribbing.

Row 2: Sk 2 sl sts, sc in next 6 sts, ch 1, turn.

Row 3: Sc in next 6 sc, sl st in next 2 sc of front edge, turn.

Row 4: Sk 2 sl sts, sc in next 2 Work same as for back. (26-28-31) | sc, ch 2, sk next 2 sc (buttonhole). sc in next 2 sc, ch 1, turn.

Row 5: Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in ch-2 sp, sc in next 2 sc, sl st in next 2 sc on front edge, turn.

Row 6: Rep Row 2.

Row 7: Sc in next 6 sc, al st in end of base row, sl st in side of hdc at end of Row 1 of front, turn.

Note: For each even-numbered row rep Row 2. Even-numbered rows will not appear on pattern, simply rep Row 2.

Row 9: Sc in next 6 sc, sl st in each ch of turning ch-2 at end of next row on front, turn.

Row 11: Sc in next 6 sc, sl st in next row of front, sl st in first ch on turning ch-2 of next row.

Row 13: Sc in next 6 sc, sl st in 2nd ch of turning ch-2 on front, sl st in next row.

Continue in same manner up front edge, working 1 sl st in each ch of turning ch-2 and 1 sl st in end of hdc at end of row. This yields 3 neck band rows for each 2 hdc rows on front. At the same time, work a buttonhole row every 10th (11th-12th) row 3 more times after first buttonhole for a total of 4 buttonholes. Work a total of 37 (40-43) rows.

To turn corner, after next 4 odd rows, work 1 sl st (instead of 2 sl sts) on front edge and turn. This yields 3 neck band rows for each hde row on front.

Continue working ribbing across right front edge to shoulder edge and across shoulder to sts on center back (work same as Rows 9-13 of neck band). To work across center back, at end of each odd row, work sl st in each of next 2 hdc. Finish neck band similarly, working 1 sl st at corner on left front edge for 4 consecutive odd rows to turn corner. Fasten off after sl stitching in last st at left bottom corner.

Count 21 (22½-24) rows down from shoulder seam on side of front and back and mark with CC piece of yarn. Sew sleeves between markers. matching center of sleeve to shoulder seam. Sew side and sleeve seams, Sew buttons opposite buttonholes. *

Intermediate

MATERIALS

- Crochet cotton size 10 in 400-yd balls*:
 13 balls white
- Steel crochet hook size 7
- · Starching agent
- · Tapestry needle

*Coats & Clark South Maid crochet cotton was used in the sample project.

GAUGE

Rnd 1 = 1 inch; 11 sts = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

Finished tablecloth consists of 140 motifs. Crochet together 10 x 14 motifs.

Treble crochet (tr): Yo hook 2 times, insert hook in indicated st, draw up a lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times.

Double treble crochet (dtr): Yo hook 3 times, insert hook in indicated st, draw up a lp, [yo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 4 times.

Front post treble crochet (fptr): Yo hook 2 times, insert hook front

to back to front around vertical post of indicated st, draw up a lp, lyo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times.

FIRST MOTIF

Rnd 1: Ch 6, join to form a ring, ch 5 (first dc, ch 2), tr in ring, ch 2, "dtr in ring, ch 2, tr in ring, ch 2, dc in ring, ch 2, tr in ring, ch 2, rep from * 2 times, dtr in ring, ch 2, tr in ring, ch 2, sl st to join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5.

Rnd 2: Ch 5, dc in next tr, "work 1 dc, ch 3, 1 dc in next dtr, ch 2, dc in tr, ch 2, dc in dc, ch 2, dc in tr, ch 2, rep from * 2 times, dc, ch 3, dc in dtr, ch 2, dc in tr, ch 2, sl st to join in 3rd ch of beg ch-5.

Rnd 3: Ch 3, 2 dc in ch-2 sp, *dc in next dc, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in next dc, 2 dc, ch 3, 2 dc in ch-3 corner sp, [dc in next dc, 2 dc in ch-2 sp] 3 times, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, *[fpdc around next dc, dc in next dc] 4 times, dc, ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, [dc in next dc, fpdc around next dc] 4 times, dc in next dc, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 5: Ch 3, *[fpdc around next dc, dc in next dc] 4 times, fpdc around next dc, dc, ch 3, dc in next ch-3 sp, fpdc around next dc, [dc in next dc, fpdc around next dc] 4 times, dc in next dc, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 6: Sl st under post of next dc, draw up a lp, ch 5, [sk 1 dc, fptr around next fpdc, ch 1] 4 times, tr, ch 5, tr in ch-3 sp, *[ch 1, sk 1 dc, fptr around next fpdc] 10 times, ch

 tr, ch 5, tr in ch-3 sp, rep from * 2 times, [sk 1 dc, fptr around next fpdc, ch 1] 5 times, sl st to join in 4th ch of beg ch-5.

Rnd 7: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, [ch 5, sc in next tr] 5 times, [ch 5, sc in ch-5 lp] 2 times, *[ch 5, sc in next tr] 12 times, [ch 5, sc in ch-5 lp] 2 times, rep from * 2 more times, [ch 5, sc in next tr] 6 times, the following last step sets crochet hook up in the middle of the ch lp to work following rnd, ch 2, dc in beg sc.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, sc in same ch sp as beg ch-1, [ch 7, sc in next ch lp] 7 times, ch 7, sc in same lp (corner), *[ch 7, sc in next ch lp] 14 times, ch 7, sc in same ch lp (corner), rep from * 2 times, [ch 7, sc in next ch lp] 6 times, ch 7, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

SECOND & REMAINING MOTIFS

Rnds 1-7: Rep Rnds 1-7 of first motif.

Rnd 8: Rnd 8 of motif is worked in same manner except join adjoining sides of motif from corner ch-7 lp to next corner ch-7 lp as follows: Ch 3, join with sl st to center of corresponding lp on previous motif, ch 3, sc in same lp, [ch 3, join with sl st to center of next lp on previous motif, ch 3, sc in next lp] 14 times, ch 3, join to center of corner lp on previous motif, ch 3, sc in same lp.

BORDER

Rnd 1: Attach crochet cotton in any joining between 2 motifs, ch 8, *[sc in next ch-7 lp, ch 1] 13 times, sc in next ch-7 lp, ch 5, dc in joining between 2 motifs, ch 5, rep from * until you reach the lp before the corner lp, work corners as follows: ch 5, sc in corner ch-7 lp, ch 5, repeat in this manner around entire outer edge, ending with ch 5, sl st in 3rd st of beg ch-8.

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in same st as beg ch-1, *4 sc over ch-5 lp, [sc in sc, sc over ch-1 spl 13 times, sc in sc, 4 sc over ch-5 lp, sc in dc, rep from * across side, working over corners consisting of ch 5, sc and ch 5 from previous rnd as follows, 4 sc over ch-5 lp, 3 sc in sc, 4 sc over ch-5 lp, rep in this manner around, with 1 sc in each sc, 1 sc in each dc, 1 sc over each ch-1 lp, 4 sc over each ch-5 lp and 3 sc in each of the 4 corner sc, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

Starch and block tablecloth according to thread manufacturer's directions. *

Row 2: Hdc in each hdc across, ch 1, turn.

Rep Row 2 for 12 inches, changing to 2 strands dusty rose crochet cotton, fasten off coral crochet cotton.

Rep Row 2 until dusty rose section measures 6 inches, fasten off.

Working with matching sleeve colors of crochet cotton, al st sleeve seam closed.

Sleeve shaping

Rnd 1: With crochet hook size E, attach 2 strands of coral crochet cotton in opposite side of foundation ch at sleeve seam, ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next 2 chs] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc, do not turn. (32-36-40)

Rnd 2: Ch 3, dc in each sc around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, do not turn.

Rnd 3: Ch 3, [fpdc around next dc, bpdc around next dc] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, do not turn.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, [fpdc around fpdc, bpdc around bpdc] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

Rep Rnd 4 until sleeve ribbing measures 3 inches from beg, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

With matching colors of crochet cotton, sl st fronts to back across shoulders. Leaving 8 (9-10) inches for sleeve opening, sl st side seams closed.

SI st sleeves into armhole openings.

BOTTOM RIBBING

Row 1 (Right side): With crochet hook size E, attach 2 strands of coral crochet cotton in opposite side of foundation ch at edge of left front, ch 1, sc in each ch across, ch 3, turn.

Row 2: De in each se across, ch

3, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, [fpdc around next dc, bpdc around next dc] rep across, ch 3, turn.

Row 4: [Fpdc around each fpdc and bpdc around each bpdc] rep across, ch 3, turn.

Rep Row 4 until bottom ribbing measures 3 inches from beg, fasten off.

NECKLINE RIBBING

Row 1 (Right side): With crochet hook size E, attach 2 strands of coral crochet cotton in right front neckline edge, ch 1, sc evenly sp around neckline edge, turn.

Row 2: Ch 3, dc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3: Ch 3, [fpdc around next dc, bpdc around next dc] rep across, turn.

Row 4: Ch 3, [fpdc around fpdc, bpdc around bpdc] rep across, turn.

Rows 5 & 6: Rep Row 4. At the end of Row 6, fasten off.

LEFT FRONT BORDER

Row 1 (Wrong side): With cro-

chet hook size E, attach 2 strands of coral crochet cotton in lower edge, ch 1, work 102 sc sts evenly sp up front edge, ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-8: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 8, fasten off.

RIGHT FRONT BORDER

Row 1 (Right side): With crochet hook size E, attach 2 strands of coral crochet cotton in lower edge, ch 1, work 102 sc sts evenly sp up front edge, ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-4: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 5: Sc in next 4 sc, [ch 3, sk 3 sts, sc in next 10 sts] 7 times, ch 3, sk 3 sts, sc in next 4 sts, ch 1, turn.

Row 6: Sc in each sc and 3 sc in each ch-3 sp across, ch 1, turn.

Rows 7 & 8: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 8, fasten off.

With the sewing needle and the thread, sew buttons opposite buttonholes. *

Row 2: De in 8th ch from hook, ch 2, sk next 2 chs, de in next de, [ch 2, de in next de (sp)] 14 times, [2 de in next sp, de in next de (bl)] twice, 6 sp, 4 bl, 6 sp, 2 bl, 14 sp, drop thread. To inc 2 sp at end of row, attach a separate piece of thread to top of last de on previous row, ch 6, fasten off, pick up dropped thread and work 2 sp, ch 10, turn.

Row 3: Increase 2 sp at beg and end of row same as for Row 2, work 18 sp, 3 bl, 3 sp, 2 bl, 1 sp, 2 bl, 1 sp, 2 bl, 3 sp, 3 bl, 18 sp, ch 7, turn.

Row 4: Dc in first dc, 13 sp, 3 bl, 3 sp, 3 bl, 1 sp, 4 bl, ch 6, 4 bl, 1 sp, 3 bl, 3 sp, 3 bl, 13 sp, drop thread, to increase 1 sp at end of row, attach separate piece of thread and work 1 sp, ch 7, turn.

Row 5: Increase 1 sp at beg and end of row same as for Row 4, work 14 sp, 1 bl, ch 6, 3 bl, 2 sp, 2 bl, 1 sp, 3 bl, ch 6, sc in next lp, ch 6, 3 bl, 1 sp, 2 bl, 2 sp, 3 bl, ch 6, 1 bl, 14 sp, ch 5, turn.

Row 6: Sk first dc, dc in next dc, 12 sp, 1 bl, ch 5, sc in next lp, ch 5, 3 bl, 5 sp, 1 bl, ch 5, sc in next lp, ch 6, sc in next lp, ch 5, 1 bl, 5 sp, 3 bl, ch 5, sc in next lp, ch 5, 1 bl, 13 sp, ch 7, turn.

Row 7: Increase 1 sp at beg and end of row same as for Row 4, work 15 sp, 3 dc in next lp, ch 5, 3 dc in next lp, dc in next dc, 2 bl, 2 sp, 2 bl, 1 sp, 2 bl, 3 dc in next lp, ch 5, sc in next lp, ch 5, 3 dc in next lp, dc in next dc, 2 bl, 1 sp, 2 bl, 2 sp, 2 bl, 3 dc in next lp, ch 5, 3 dc in next lp, dc in next lp, ch 5, 3 dc in next lp, dc in next lp, ch 5, 3 dc in next lp, dc in next dc, 15 sp, ch 5, turn.

are worked, [ch 6, sk next dc, sc in next dc] rep across long side ending with sc in end of Row 1, complete rnd in same manner, referring to graph. (88 lps)

Row 2: Sk first 2 sc, sk next tr, sc in next sp, [ch 3, sc in next sp] 4 times, ch 3, sk next tr, sk next sc, sl st in next sc, ch 3, sk ch-3, sc in next sc, ch 3, turn.

Row 3: Dc in top of last sc worked, [2 tr in next ch-3 lp, ch 3, dc in top of last tr worked] 6 times, 2 tr in side of sc at end of Row 1 of scallop, sk next 3 tr on Rnd 2 of edging, sc in next tr, sc in next sp, sc in next tr.

Rep last 3 rows for scallop, starting at * on Row 1 for a total of 24 scallops, ending with sl st in first sc to join, fasten off.



Double crochet cluster (dc cl): Yo hook, insert hook in indicated st, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook, yo, insert hook in indicated st, draw up a lp, yo, draw through 2 lps on hook, yo, draw through rem 3 lps on hook.

DOILY

Rnd 1: Ch 11, join to form a ring, ch 4, tr in ring (beg tr cluster), ch 2, [tr cl in ring, ch 2] 10 times, sl st to join in top of beg ch-4. (11 clusters)

Rnd 2: Ch 4, tr in same st as beg ch-4 (first tr cl made on top of tr cl of Rnd 1), ch 4, [tr cl in top of next tr cl, ch 4] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-4.

Rnd 3: Ch 4, tr in same st as beg ch-4, ch 6, [tr cl in top of next tr cl, ch 6] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-4.





Rows 2-4: Ch 3 (first dc), dc in next 143 dc, turn.

At end of Row 4, fasten off, turn.

Row 5 (Right side): Attach lavender pastels yarn in first st, ch 3 (first dc), dc in next st, [sk next 3 sts, tr in next st, working in back of tr, dc in first skipped stitch, dc in each next 2 skipped stitches] 35 times, dc in each of next 2 sts, turn.

Row 6 (Wrong side): Ch 3 (first dc), dc in next st, [sk next 3 sts, tr in next st, working in front of tr, dc in first skipped stitch, dc in each next 2 skipped stitches] 35 times, dc in each next 2 sts, fasten off, turn.

Row 7 (Right side): Attach light lavender yarn, ch 3 (first dc), dc in each next 143 sts, turn. (144)

Rows 8-10: Ch 3 (first de), de in next 143 sts, turn.

At the end of Row 10, fasten off, turn.

Rows 11 & 12: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Row 13 (Right side): Attach lily pink yarn, ch 3 (first dc), dc in next 143 sts, turn.

Rows 14-16: Rep Rows 8-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off, turn.

Rows 17 & 18: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Rows 19-22: With lily pink yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off, turn.

Rows 23 & 24: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Rows 25-28: With mist green yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off, turn.

Rows 29 & 30: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Rows 31-34: With mist green yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off, turn.

Rows 35 & 36: Rep Rows 5 and 6.

Rows 37-40: With mist green yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off,

Rows 41 & 42: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Rows 43-46: With mist green yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off,

Rows 47 & 48: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Rows 49-52: With lily pink yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off, turn.

Rows 53 & 54: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Rows 55-58: With lily pink yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off, turn.

Rows 59 & 60: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Rows 61-64: With light lavender yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off, turn.

Rows 65 & 66: Rep Rows 5 and 6. Rows 67-70: With light lavender yarn, rep Rows 7-10.

At the end of last rep, fasten off, turn.

BORDER

Rnd 1 (Right side): Attach mist green yarn in first ch of opposite side of foundation ch, ch 1, so in same ch as beg ch-1, so in each ch across, 3 so in corner st, work 2 so over side edge of each row, 3 so in corner st, so in each st across Row 70, 3 so in corner st, work 2 so over side edge of each row, ending with 2 so in same st as beg so, sl st to join, do not turn.

Rnd 2 (Right side): Ch 4, sk next sc, dc in next sc, working in front of last dc made, dc in skipped sc, *ch 1, sk next sc, dc in next sc, working in front of last dc made, dc in skipped sc, rep from * across to corner, ch 1, in corner sc work [1 dc, ch 1] 3 times in same sc, rep from * around entire outer edge, sl st to join in 3rd ch of beg ch-4, fasten off. *

Rnd 1 (Right side): With crochet hook size G and country rose yarn, ch 4, join to form a ring, ch 1, work 8 sc in ring, sl st to join in beg sc. (8)

Rnd 2 (Right side): Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, ch 2, [sc in next sc, ch 2] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 3 (Right side): Sl st into next ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same ch-2 sp as beg ch-1, 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp, [sc in next ch-2 sp, 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 4 (Right side): Ch 1, sc in each dc and each sc around, with 1 sc, ch 2, 1 sc in each corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join, fasten off. (9 sc each side between ch-2 at each corner)

Rnd 5 (Wrong side): Draw up a lp of Venice yarn in 2nd sc to the left of any corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, [ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc] rep around, working at corners, ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc, ch 2, sc in corner ch-2 sp, ending with ch 1, sk last sc, sl st to join in top of beg sc, turn. (6 sc each side between corner ch-2 sps)

Rnd 6 (Right side): Ch 3 (first dc), dc in each sc and each ch-1 sp around, working 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in each corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off. (15 dc each side between corner ch-2 sps)

Rnd 7 (Wrong side): Draw up a lp of country blue yarn in 2nd dc to the left of any corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, [ch 1, sk 1 dc, sc in next dc] rep around, working at corners, ch 1, sk 1 dc, sc, ch 2, sc in corner ch-2 sp, ending with ch 1, sk last dc, sl st to join in beg sc, turn. (9 sc each side between corner ch-2 sps)

Rnd 8 (Right side): Ch 3 (first dc), dc in each sc and each ch-1 sp around, working 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in each corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off. (21 dc each side between corner ch-2 sps)

Rnd 9 (Right side): Draw up a lp of country rose yarn in any dc on edge, ch 1, sc in each dc around, with 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in each corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off. (23 sc each side between corner ch-3 sps)

ASSEMBLY

With yarn needle and country rose yarn, working in back lps only, whipstitch squares together in strips of 7 squares. Sew 5 strips of squares together.

BORDER

Rnd 1 (Right side): With crochet hook size G, attach country rose yarn in any sc on edge of afghan, ch 1, work 1 sc in each sc, 1 sc in each ch-3 sp on side edge, 1 hdc in each joining seam and work 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in each corner ch-3 sp, sl st to join in beg sc. (181 sts each side and 129 sts each top and bottom of afghan)

Rnd 2 (Right side): Ch 1, sc in each sc around, with 1 sc, ch 3, 1 sc in each corner ch-3 sp, sl st to join

in beg sc, fasten off.

Rnd 3 (Wrong side): Draw up a lp of Venice yarn in 2nd sc to the left of any corner ch-3 sp, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, [ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc in next sc] rep around, working at each corner, ch 1, sk 1 sc, sc, ch 3, sc in corner ch-3 sp, ending with ch 1, sk last sc, sl st to join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 4 (Right side): Ch 3 (first dc), dc in each sc and each ch-1 sp around, working 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in each corner ch-3 sp, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off, turn.

Rnd 5 (Wrong side): Draw up a lp of country blue yarn in 2nd dc to the left of any corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, [ch 1, sk 1 dc, sc in next dc] rep around, working at each corner, ch 1, sk 1 dc, sc, ch 3, sc in corner ch-2 sp, ending with ch 1, sk last dc, sl st to join in beg sc, turn.

Rnd 6 (Right side): Ch 3 (first dc), dc in each sc and each ch-1 sp around, working 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in each corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join in

top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 7 (Right side): Ch 1, sc in each dc around, working sc, ch 3, sc in each corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

Rnd 8 (Wrong side): With country rose yarn, rep Rnd 3 of border.

Rnd 9 (Right side): Rep Rnd 4 of border, sl st to join, ch 1, do not fasten off.

Rnd 10 (Right side): Rep Rnd 7 of border, sl st to join in beg sc, sl st in next 3 sc.

Rnd 11 (Right side): Ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, work corner 1 (and corner 3), sk 2 sc, 3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc in corner ch-3 sp, sc in next sc, [sk 3 sc, shell of 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in next sc, sk 3 sc, sc in next sc] rep around, working at corners 2 and 4, shell of 3 dc, ch 3, 3 dc in corner ch-3 sp, sk 2 sc, sc in next sc, ending with sk last 3 sc, join last dc of shell to beg sc, draw up a lp, remove hook.

Rnd 12 (Right side): With crochet hook size F, pick up dropped loop, ch 1, sc, ch 3, sc in first sc, work corner pattern of ch 4, sl st, ch 3, sl st, ch 5, sl st, ch 3 and sl st in corner ch-3 sp, ch 4, sc, ch 3, sc in next sc, |ch 4, sc, ch 3, sc in ch-2 sp of shell, ch 4, sc, ch 3, sc in next sc] rep around, repeating corner pattern in rem 3 corners, ending with join last ch 4 to beg sc, fasten off.

FINISHING

With wrong side of afghan facing, block with steam iron. *

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

When pattern indicates to work in the 2nd back loop of a stitch, this refers to the horizontal loop at back of stitch that is directly below the 2 top loops of a dc stitch.

Treble crochet (tr): Yo hook 2 times, insert hook in indicated st, draw up a lp, lyo, draw through 2 lps on hook] 3 times.

HEART SQUARES (make 32)

Rnd 1 (Right side): With heart color, ch 4, 2 dc in 4th ch from hook, [ch 2, 3 dc in same ch] 3 times, ch 2, sl st to join in top of beg ch, do not turn. (12)

Rnd 2 (Right side): Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp, dc in each next 3 dc, 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 spl 3 times, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

Note: Row 3 forms the 2 top heart lobes. Row 4 shapes the bottom of the heart to retain the square shape.

Row 3 (Right side): Attach heart color with sl st in any ch-2 sp, [sk 3 dc, 9 tr in next dc, sk 3 dc, sl st in next ch-2 spl 2 times, do not work in rem sts, fasten off.

Row 4 (Right side): Attach white yarn with sl st in back lp of last ch-2 sp worked, [sk 3 dc, 9 tr in 2nd back Ip of next dc, sl st in back lp of next ch-2 spl twice, fasten off.

Rnd 5 (Right side): Attach white yarn with sl st in 2nd back lp of 5th tr of first tr group worked in Row 3, ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc in same st, hdc in next 2nd back lp, sc in next 2nd back lp, hdc in next 2nd back lp, de in next 2nd back lp, tr in next 2nd back lp, dc in next 2nd back lp, hdc in next 2nd back lp, sc in next 2nd back lp, hdc in next 2nd back lp, 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next 2nd back lp, hdc in next 2nd back lp, sc in next 2nd back lp, hdc in next 2nd back lp, dc in next 2nd back lp, tr in next 2nd back lp, dc between next 2 sts, hdc between next 2 sts, sc between next 2 sts, hdc between next 2 sts, 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc between next 2 sts, hdc between next 2 sts, sc between next 2 sts, hdc between next 2 sts, dc between next 2 sts, tr in same sp as sl st of previous row, dc between sl st and next st, hdc between next 2 sts, sc between next 2 sts, hdc between next 2 sts, 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc between next 2 sts, hdc between next 2 sts, sc between next 2 sts, hdc between next 2 sts, dc between next 2 sts, tr in same sp as sl | in each st around, with 2 hdc, ch 2,

Rnd 6 (Right side): Ch 3, dc in each st around entire outer edge, working 2 de, ch 2, 2 de in each corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

SOLID SQUARES (make 31)

Rnd 1 (Right side): With square color, ch 4, 2 dc in 4th ch from hook, ch 2, [3 de in same ch, ch 2| 3 times, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 2 (Right side): Ch 3, dc in next 2 dc, 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in ch-2 sp, [dc in next 3 dc, 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in next ch-2 sp] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnds 3 & 4 (Right side): Ch 3, de in each de around, working 2 de, ch 2, 2 dc in each ch-2 sp around, al st to join in top of beg ch-3.

Rnd 5 (Right side): Ch 1, sc in each de around, working 3 sc in each ch-2 sp around, sl st to join, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

Alternate heart squares and solid squares.

Work in back lps only of each square.

With right sides of 2 squares facing, attach white yarn in back lp only of each square, working through both thicknesses, sc across edge, fasten off.

Rep joining squares until you have 7 strips of 9 squares each.

Working in same manner, holding 2 strips together, crochet strips together. Afghan will be 7 squares wide x 9 squares long.

BORDER

Rnd 1 (Right side): Attach CC yarn in any corner ch-2 sp, ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc in same ch-2 sp, dc evenly sp around entire outer edge, with 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in each 3 remaining ch-2 corner sps, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Rnd 2 (Wrong side): Ch 2, hdc

2 hdc in each corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2, fasten off, turn.

Rnd 3 (Right side): Attach white yarn in any corner ch-2 sp, ch 3, dc, ch 2, 2 dc in same corner ch-2 sp, dc in each st around, with 2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc in each remaining corner ch-2 sp, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, turn.

Rnd 4 (Wrong side): Rep Rnd 2. Rnd 5 (Right side): Attach CC yarn the same as Rnd 1 and rep Rnd 3.

Rnd 6 (Wrong side): Rep Rnd 2. Rnd 7 (Right side): Rep Rnd 3. At the end of Rnd 7, do not turn.

Rnd 8 (Right side): Ch 1, reverse sc in each dc and each ch around entire outer edge, sl st to join, fasten off. *

- 4-ply yarn in 3½-oz skeins*:
 - 8 skeins No 111 eggshell
 - 3 skeins No 245 orange

 - 4 skeins No 48 teal
- Crochet hook size I/9
- · Yarn needle

*Coats & Clark Red Heart Classion yarn was used in the sample project.

GAUGE

3 dc rnds = 2 inches; 3 dc = % inch

PATTERN NOTE

Weave in loose ends as work progresses.

FLOWERS (make 35)

Note: Make 11 autumn red flowers and 8 flowers each of orange, taupe and teal. Rnd 1 (Right side): With flower color, ch 12, sl st to join to form a ring, ch 3 (first dc), work 31 dc in ring, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3. (32)

Rnd 2: Ch 3 (first dc), dc in next 3 dc, ch 2, turn, 2 dc in each next 3 dc, 2 dc in top of beg ch-3, ch 3, turn, [1 dc in each next 4 dc of Rnd 1, ch 2, turn, 2 dc in each of next 4 dc, ch 3, turn] 7 times, ending with sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off. (8 petals)

GRANNY SQUARE

Rnd 3: Attach eggshell yarn in any ch-3 sp, ch 3 (first dc), 2 dc, ch 2 and 3 dc in same ch-3 sp for corner, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, [corner of 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, ch 1] 3 times, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, sl st into corner ch-2 sp.

Rnd 4: Ch 3 (first de), 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in same ch-2 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, [3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch-2 sp of corner, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1, 3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] 3 times, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

Rnd 5: Attach same yarn color as flower in corner ch-2 sp, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] rep across edge to within corner ch-2 sp, *3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] rep across edge to within corner ch-2 sp, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, sl st into corner ch-2 sp.

Rnd 6: Ch 3 (first de), 2 de, ch 2, 3 de in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 de in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] rep across to within corner ch-2 sp, *3 de, ch 2, 3 de in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 de in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] rep across edge to within corner ch-2 sp, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, sl st into corner ch-2 sp.

Rnd 7: Rep Rnd 6, fasten off.

Rnd 8: Attach eggshell yarn in corner ch-2 sp, rep Rnd 6, fasten off.

ASSEMBLY

With yarn needle and eggshell yarn, following afghan diagram, sew squares together.

BORDER

Rnd 1: Attach eggshell yarn in any corner ch-2 sp, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in ch sp, ch 1] rep across edge in each ch sp to within corner ch-2 sp, *3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch sp, ch 1] rep across edge in each ch sp to within corner sp, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

Rnd 2: Attach orange yarn in corner ch-2 sp, ch 3, 2 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] rep across edge to within corner ch-2 sp, *3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in corner ch-2 sp, ch 1, [3 dc in next ch-1 sp, ch 1] rep across edge to within corner sp, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

Rnd 3: With autumn red yarn, rep Rnd 2.

Rnd 4: With taupe yarn, rep Rnd 2.

Rnd 5: With teal yarn, rep Rnd 2, do not fasten off.

Rnd 6: SI st into corner ch-2 sp, ch 2 (first hdc), 4 dc and 1 hdc in corner ch-2 sp, *1 sc in center dc of next 3-dc group, [3 dc in ch-1 sp, 1 sc in center dc of next 3-dc group] rep across to within corner ch-2 sp, 1 hdc, 4 dc and 1 hdc in corner ch-2 sp, rep from * around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-2, fasten off. *





SIZE

8 inches tall

MATERIALS

- 4-ply yarn:
 3 oz orange
 3 oz medium green
 1 oz black yarn
- Crochet hooks sizes G/6 and H/8
- 4 cardboard circles 4¼ inches in diameter
- 2 plastic canvas 4¼-inch squares
- · Black felt
- · Glue
- · Yarn needle

GAUGE

With crochet hook size G, 4 sc = 1 inch; 4 sc rnds = 1 inch

PATTERN NOTES

Weave in loose ends as work progresses. Do not join rnds unless otherwise indicated. Use a scrap of CC yarn to mark rnds.

PUMPKIN HEAD (make 8)

Rnd 1: With crochet hook size G and orange yarn, ch 2, 6 sc in 2nd ch from hook. (6)

Rnd 2: Work 2 sc in each sc around. (12)

Rnd 3: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (18) Rnd 4: [Sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (24)

Rnd 5: [Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (30)

Rnd 6: Sc in each sc around.

Rnd 7: [Sc in next 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around. (36)

Rnd 8: |Sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc| rep around. (42)

Rnd 9: (Sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc) 10 times, sc in next 2 sc, sl st in next sc, fasten off. (52)

Rnd 10: Holding 2 head sections together with 1 cardboard circle between crocheted pieces and working through both thicknesses, attach orange, ch 1, sc in each sc around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

Stem

Row 1: With crochet hook size G, attach medium green yarn in any sc of Rnd 10, ch 6, 2 hdc in 3rd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, sc in each next 2 chs, sl st in same sc as joining, fasten off.

Rep Row 1 of stem on each pumpkin head.

Stem is center top of pumpkin.

FACIAL FEATURES

From black felt, cut 2 eyes, 1 nose and 1 mouth for each pumpkin face (see next page).

Glue nose centered on pumpkin face below stem. Glue eyes above nose and mouth below nose.

BASE (make 2)

Row 1: With crochet hook size H and black yarn, ch 16, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (15)

Rows 2-15: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn. At the end of first base, fasten off. At the end of 2nd base, do not fasten off.

Rnd 16: Holding both base pieces together with 1 plastic canvas square between crocheted layers, ch 1, sc evenly sp around entire outer edge, sl st to join, fasten off.

Stitch pumpkin heads to base starting at 21st st from stem and sewing across next 8 sts and through 9 sts at side of base. Stitch pumpkin heads together at sides leaving 6 sts on each side of stem and 5 sts on each side at bottom corners.

BOTTOM TRIM

Rnd 1: Holding top opening of dish facing, with crochet hook size H, attach medium green yarn with sc in st at corner where 2 pumpkin heads join, sc in next 4 sts at corner, sc across 9 sts of base where stitched to head, [1 sc in each of 10 sts around opening corner, 1 sc in each of 9 bottom sts of base where sewed to head] rep around, ending with sc in last 5 sc of first corner, sl st to join in beg sc. (76)

Rnd 2: Ch 1, sc in each st around, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 3: To close first half of corner, ch 1, sc through next sc and first sc at corner of base, sc through next 2 sc and next 2 sc on base, [sc in next 13 sc, close corner opening by working sc through next sc and sc of base a total of 6 times] rep around, ending with close last half of corner, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 4: Ch 3, dc in same st as beg ch-3, work 2 dc in each sc around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

LEAF TOP Leaves (make 4)

Row 1: With crochet hook size H and 2 strands medium green yarn held together, ch 6, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, turn. (5)

Row 2: Ch 1, work 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (7)

Row 3: Ch 1, work 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (9)

Row 4: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 5: Ch 2, dc and sc in same st as beg ch-2, sc in next 7 sc, sc and dc in last sc, turn.

Row 6: Ch 2, dc and sc in same st as beg ch-2, sc in next st, sl st in next 7 sts, sc and dc in last st, turn.

Row 7: Ch 1, sl st in next 4 sts, ch 1, sc in next 5 sts, turn.

Row 8: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next 3 sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (7)

Row 9: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 10: Ch 2, dc and sc in same st as beg ch-2, sc in next 5 sc, sc and de in last se, turn.

st as beg ch-2, sc in next st, sl st in next 5 sts, sc in next st, sc and dc in last st, turn.

Row 12: Ch 1, sl st in next 4 sts, ch 1, sc in next 3 sc, turn.

Row 13: Ch 1, 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in last sc, turn. (5)

Row 14: Ch 1, sc in each sc across, turn.

Row 15: Ch 1, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, turn. (3)

Row 16: Ch 1, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next sc, turn. (2)

Row 17: Ch 1, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, fasten off. (1)

With yarn needle and length of medium green yarn, stitch Rows 1-6 of leaves together.

Stem

Rnd 18: With crochet hook size H, attach 1 strand medium green yarn in opposite side of foundation ch at beg of any leaf, ch 1, work 20 sc around opening, sl st to join. (20)

Rnd 19: Ch 1, [dec 1 sc over next 2 sc 10 times, sl st to join. (10)

Row 11: Ch 2, dc and sc in same

Rnd 20: Rep Rnd 19. (5)

Rnd 21: Ch 1, sc in next sc, [dec I sc over next 2 sel twice, sl st to join. (3)

Row 22: Ch 7, hdc in 3rd ch from hook, hdc in next ch, sc in each next 3 chs, sl st to join at base of beg ch-7, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

With rem length of yarn, sew top opening at base of Row 22 closed.

INSIDE COVER

Row 1: With crochet hook size H and medium green yarn, ch 16, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn.

Rows 2-15: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 15, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

With wrong side of leaf top facing, insert rem plastic canvas square. With yarn needle and rem length of yarn on inside cover, sew inside cover to leaf top. Place cover on top of dish. *



Rnd 10: Ch 1, sc in each next 5 sc, 2 dc in each next 4 sc, 2 dc in each next 4 sc, 2 dc in each next 4 sc (first shoulder), sc in each next 5 sc, 2 dc in each next 4 sc (2nd shoulder), sl st to join in beg sc. (26 sts)

Rnd 11: Ch 1, sc in next 5 sc, dc in next 8 dc, sc in next 5 sc, dc in next 8 dc, sl st to join in beg sc. (26)

Rnd 12: Ch 1, sc in next 7 sts, 2 dc in each next 4 sts, sc in next 9 sts, 2 dc in each next 4 sts, sc in each next 2 sts, sl st to join in beg sc. (34)

Rnd 13: Ch 1, sc in next 7 sc, dc in next 8 dc, sc in next 9 sc, dc in next 8 dc, sc in next 2 sc, sl st to join in beg sc. (34)

Rnd 14: Ch 1, work 2 sc in each next 7 sc, sk next 8 dc, work 2 sc in each next 9 sc, sk next 8 dc, 2 sc in each next 2 sc, sl st to join in beg sc. (36 sc)

Rnd 15: Ch 1, [sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc. (42)

Rnds 16-28: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, sl st to join in beg sc. (42)

Rnd 29: Ch 1, [sc in next sc, 3 dc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

FACIAL FEATURES

Note: Embroider pepper shaker facial features with black yarn and embroider salt shaker facial features with grass green yarn.

Eyes

With yarn needle and yarn, embroider 2 lazy-daisy sts over Rnds 4 and 5 leaving 3 sc sts between eyes.

Mouth

With yarn needle and yarn, embroider a smiling mouth in straight sts over Rnds 7 and 8. *

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc. (18)

Rnd 4: Rep Rnd 3. (27)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [sc in each next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc. (36)

SPIDER HEAD & LEGS

Rnd 6 (Right side): Ch 3 (first dc), 2 dc in same st as beg ch-3, 2 dc in next sc, ch 3, sl st in same st, sc in each next 3 sc, [ch 6, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each next 4 chs, sc in next 3 sc] 4 times, sc in next 4 sc, [ch 6, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, sl st in each next 4 chs, sc in next 3 sc] 4 times, sl st in each next 4 chs, sc in next 3 sc] 4 times, sl st in next st, base of beg ch-3, fasten off.

EYES (make 2)

With yarn needle and length of mulberry yarn, embroider 2 French knots for eyes. *

Row 7: Rep Row 4.

Row 8: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next 4 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (6)

Row 9: Rep Row 4.

Row 10: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in next 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (4)

Row 11: Rep Row 4.

Row 12: [Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] twice, ch 1, turn. (2)

Row 13: Sc in each next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. Row 14: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, fasten off. (1)

HATBAND (make 4)

Row 1: With tangerine yarn, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

With yarn needle and rem length of tangerine yarn, sew hatband over Row 5 of hat front.

HAT BACK (make 4)

Rows 1-7: With black yarn, rep Rows 1-7 of hat front. (8)

At the end of Row 7, leaving a

length of yarn, fasten off.

At the end of Row 8, fasten off tan yarn.

Row 9: Attach light blue yarn, ch 1, sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 53, fasten off.

Edging

Rnd 1: Attach tan yarn in any sc on outer edge, ch 1, sc evenly sp around entire outer edge with 3 sc in each corner sc, sl st to join.

Rnds 2 & 3: Ch 1, sc in each sc around, with 3 sc in each center sc of each corner, sl st to join.

At the end of Rnd 3, fasten off.

WINDOW TOP & BOTTOM (make 2)

Row 1: With white yarn, ch 46, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (45)

Row 2: Sc in each sc across, fasten off.

Sew panels around entire outer edge to pillow front. Sew bottom panel to Rows 9 and 10 and top panel to Rows 52 and 53.

WINDOW SIDE PANELS (make 2)

Row 1: With white yarn, ch 41, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (40)

Row 2: Sc in each sc across, fasten off.

Sew panels around entire outer edge to pillow front. Sew side panels in line with top and bottom panels.

WINDOW CENTER PANEL (make 1)

Row 1: With white yarn, ch 41, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (40)

Row 2: Sc in each sc across, fasten off. Sew center panel around entire outer edge to pillow front. Sew panel across center of window opening between top and bottom panels.

CAT

Row 1: Starting at bottom of cat, with black yarn, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (12)

Rows 2-4: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to within last sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (18)

Row 5: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each rem sc across, ch 1, turn. (19)

Row 6: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Rows 7-9: Rep Row 6.

Row 10: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in each rem sc across, ch 1, turn. (18)

Row 11: Rep Row 6.

Rows 12-15: Rep Row 10. (14)

Row 16: Sc in each sc across to within last 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (13)

Rows 17-20: Rep Row 6.

Row 21: Rep Row 16. (12)

Row 22: Rep Row 6.

Rows 23 & 24: Rep Row 10. (10) Rows 25-35: Rep Row 6.

First ear

Row 36: Sc in each next 3 sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Row 37: Sc in first sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (2)

Row 38: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, fasten off. (10)

Second ear

Row 36: With Row 35 facing and finished ear to the right, attach black yarn in next sc, ch 1, sc in same sc as beg ch-1, sc in next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Rows 37 & 38: Rep Rows 37 and 38 of first ear.

Position cat on right edge of pillow with Row 1 of cat sitting on Row 3 of pillow front, sew cat to pillow front around entire outer edge.

Tail

Row 1: With black yarn, ch 30, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (29)

Row 2: Sl st in first sc, sc in each rem sc across, fasten off.

Sew tail to center back of cat and along right side of body.

PLANT POT

Row 1: With brown yarn, ch 8, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (7)

Row 2: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 3: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to within last sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (9)

Rows 4 & 5: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Rows 6-11: Rep Rows 3-5. (13)

Row 2: SI st in next 3 sI sts, sc in next 21 sc, fasten off.

SHORT PLANTS (make 2)

Row 1: With green yarn, ch 13, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each next 8 chs, sl st in next 3 chs, ch 1, turn.

Row 2: SI st in each next 3 sl sts, sc in next 9 sc, fasten off.

Sew plants in plant pot, sewing 3 tall plants at center and 2 short plants at each side of the taller plants.

PILLOW BACK

Row 1: With tan yarn, ch 49, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (48)

Rows 2-55: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Rnd 56: Sc evenly sp around entire outer edge, working 3 sc in each center corner sc around, sl st to join in beg sc, do not fasten off.

JOINING

Rnd 1: With wrong sides of pillow facing, working through both thicknesses, ch 1, sc evenly sp around entire outer edge, with 3 sc in each center corner sc, stuffing with fiberfill before closing, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off. *

Rnd 2: Ch 1, work 2 sc in each sc around, sl st to join in beg sc. (16)

Rnd 3: Ch 1, [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc. (24)

Rnd 4: Ch 1, [sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc. (32)

Rnd 5: Ch 1, [sc in next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc. (36)

Rnd 6: Ch 1, sc in first sc, sk 2 sc, 5 dc in next sc, sk 2 sc, [sc in next sc, sk 2 sc, 5 dc in next sc, sk 2 sc] rep around, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 7: Ch 3 (first dc), 6 dc in same sc as beg ch-3, sc in center dc of next 5-dc group, [7 dc in next sc, sc in center dc of 5-dc group] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, sl st to center dc of 7-dc group.

Rnd 8: Ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, 7 dc in next sc, [sc in center dc of 7-dc group, 7 dc in next sc]

rep around, sl st to join in beg sc.

Rnd 9: Ch 3 (first dc), 4 dc in same sc as beg ch-3, sc in center dc of 7-dc group, [5 dc in next sc, sc in center dc of 7-dc group] rep around, sl st to join in top of beg ch-3, fasten off.

Rnd 10: Draw up a lp of bronze yarn in center dc of any 5-dc group of Rnd 9, ch 1, sc in same dc as beg ch-1, sc in next dc, [hdc in next dc, dc in next sc, hdc in next dc, sc in next 3 dc] rep around, ending with on last rep, sc in last dc instead of 3 dc, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

Rnd 11: Draw up a lp of grass green in first sc of previous rnd, ch 1, sc in each st around, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off. (36)

FINISHING

Cut ribbon in half. Attach first length of ribbon around the post of first sc of Rnd 11, tie ends in bow. Sk next 17 sc sts of Rnd 11, attach 2nd length of ribbon around post of 18th sc, tie ends in a bow. *

Row 1: With crochet hook size G and light pink yarn, ch 10, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn.

Rows 2 & 3: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to within last sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (13)

Row 4: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in each sc across to within last 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (11)

Row 5: Rep Row 4. (9)

Rows 6-9: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to within last sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (17)

Rows 10-12: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 13: Rep Row 4. (15)

Row 14: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 15: Rep Row 4. (13)

Row 16: Sl st in next 5 sc, sc in each next 3 sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Row 17: Sc in each next 3 sc, ch 1, turn.

Rnd 18: Sc evenly sp around entire outer edge of head, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

HEAD BACK

Rows 1-15: Rep Rows 1-15 of head front.

Rnd 16: Sc evenly sp around entire outer edge of head, sl st to join in beg sc, fasten off.

At this time, do not sew head sections together.

EARS (make 4)

Row 1: Starting at tip of ear, with crochet hook size G and light pink yarn, ch 3, 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in next ch, ch 1, turn. (2)

Row 2: Sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Row 3: Se in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, 2 | yarn, fasten off.

sc in next sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Row 5: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (5)

Row 6: Sc in each sc across to within last sc, 2 sc in last sc, fasten off. (6)

INNER EAR (make 2)

Row 1: With crochet hook size G and rose pink yarn, ch 2, sc in 2nd ch from hook, ch 1, turn. (1)

Row 2: Work 2 sc in the 1 sc, ch 1, turn. (2)

Row 3: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Sc in first sc, 2 sc in next sc, ch 1, turn. (3)

Row 5: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each next 2 sc, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (4)

Sew each inner ear to each ear front, making sure that the straight edge of ear is toward the top of the head, sew Row 6 of each ear section to front and back of head.

SNOUT

Note: Do not join rnds, use a scrap of CC yarn to mark rnds.

Rnd 1: With crochet hook size G and rose pink yarn, ch 4, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each next 2 chs, working on opposite side of foundation ch, sc in each next 3 chs. (6)

Rnd 2: [Sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc] 3 times. (9)

Rnd 3: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in each next 3 sc, sc in each next 2 sc, 2 sc in each next 2 sc, sl st in next sc to join, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off. (15)

NOSTRILS (make 2)

With crochet hook size D and black yarn, ch 2, sl st in 2nd ch from hook, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

With wrong side of snout facing, sew nostrils to snout.

Sew snout to head front, stuffing lightly with fiberfill before closing.

FIRST EYE SECTION (make 2)

Rnd 1: With crochet hook size G and white yarn, ch 4, al at to join to form a ring, ch 1, work 8 se in ring, al at to join, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

SECOND EYE SECTION (make 2)

Rnd 1: With crochet hook size G and black yarn, ch 3, sl st to join to form a ring, ch 1, work 6 sc in ring, sl st to join, leaving a length of yarn, fasten off.

Sew 2nd eye section on top of first eye section (black on top of white), sew eyes to head with edge touching snout.

BODY (make 2)

Row 1: With crochet hook size G and light blue yarn, ch 16, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (15)

Rows 2 & 3: Work 2 sc in first sc, sc in each sc across to within last sc, 2 sc in last sc, ch 1, turn. (19)

Rows 4-10: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 10, draw up a lp of blue gray yarn, fasten off light blue, ch 1, turn.

Rows 11-14: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in each sc across to within last 2 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (11)

Row 15: Sc in each sc across, fasten off.

LEGS (make 4)

Row 1: With crochet hook size G and blue gray yarn, ch 8, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (7)

Row 2: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, sc in each next 3 sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (5)

Rows 3-5: Se in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

At the end of Row 5, fasten off.

Sew opposite side of foundation ch of each leg to lower body at each side.

Feet (make 2)



Row 4: Working in side edge of rows and evenly sp across, work 2 sc, 2 sl sts and 2 sc, fasten off.

Sew each foot to leg front on body front.

ARMS (make 2)

Row 1: With crochet hook size G and light blue yarn, ch 5, sc in 2nd ch from hook, sc in each rem ch across, ch 1, turn. (4)

Rows 2 & 3: Sc in each sc across, ch 1, turn.

Row 4: Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, work 2 sc in each next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (5)

Row 5: Work 2 sc in each next 2 sc, sc in next sc, dec 1 sc over next 2 sc, ch 1, turn. (6)

Row 6: [Dec 1 sc over next 2 sc] twice, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next sc, fasten off, turn. (5)

Row 7: Draw up a lp of black yarn, ch 1, sc in each next 5 sc, ch 1, turn.

Row 8: Dc in each next 2 sc, sl st in next sc, dec 1 dc over next 2 sc, fasten off.

Sew arms to body front referring to photo, stuffing lightly with fiberfill as work progresses.

FINISHING

With red yarn and yarn needle, embroider a smiling mouth in backstitch under snout.

Sew buttons to center front of body.

Sew the head front to body front, with the head piece on top of body section overlapping slightly.

Sew the head back to body back, with the body piece on top of the head section overlapping slightly.

With matching yarn colors, sew front and back sections together.

Sew 1 plastic ring to center top of head.

MAMA PIG

Note: The following are worked for Mama Pig the same as for Papa Pig: head front, head back, ears, in-

ner ears, snout, nostrils, first eye section, second eye section and feet.

BODY (make 2)

Rows 1-10: With white yarn, rep the same as Papa Pig.

At the end of Row 10, fasten off white yarn.

Rows 11-15: With light pink yarn, rep the same as for Papa Pig.

LEGS (make 4)

Rows 1-5: With light pink yarn, rep the same as Papa Pig.

SKIRT

Row 1 (Wrong side): With crochet hook size G and lilac yarn, ch 19, 3 sc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 sc in next ch, [3 sc in next ch, 1 sc in next ch] rep across, turn.

Row 2 (Right side): Ch 3 (first dc), dc in each sc across, turn.

Row 3 (Wrong side): Ch 3 (first dc), dc in each dc across, fasten off, turn.

Row 4 (Right side): Working in back lps only, attach white yarn, ch 1, 3 sc in same st as beg ch-1, work 3 sc in each st across, fasten off.

With yarn needle and length of lilac yarn, sew opposite side of foundation ch to Row 10 of body front.

BOW

With crochet hook size D and lilac yarn, ch 60, fasten off.

Draw ch around center sc of Row 4 of front body, tie ends in a bow.

ARMS (make 2)

Rows 1-6: With white yarn, rep the same as for Papa Pig.

Rows 7 & 8: With black yarn, rep the same as for Papa Pig.

FINISHING

Omitting the 2 buttons, rep the same as for Papa Pig. *

HELPFUL HINT ...

SKID-PROOF SLIPPERS

Don't throw out that old suede purse. Cut it up and use it on the bottom of your next pair of crocheted slippers. A patch of suede on heel and toe will make your slippers skid-proof.
