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Materials:

- Yarn (see page one for yarns I've used)
- 2,5 mm hook size or a size that fits your yarn
- 2 black 6mm security eyes
- Embroidery thread for the details on the dress
- Scissors
- Stuffing
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker
- Pins
- Ribbon for the shoelaces





Abbreviation/US terminology:

blo - back loop ch - chain

dc - double crochet

dc3tog - double crochet three together

dec - decrease flo - front loop

hdc - half double crochet

inc - increase rnd(s) - round(s) sc - single crochet

sc3tog - single crochet three together

slst - slip stitch st - stitch tr - treble stitch

(...) - number in parentheses

indicates the number of

... - stitches at the end of the round repeat instructions x times or to

the end of the round

{...} - work the stitches all into the

same stitch

Notes:

- Do not join rounds, work in a continuous spiral unless otherwise stated.
- Change your yarn always in the last step of the last stitch.
- I mostly go up with a standing sc, hdc or dc instead of ch 1, ch 2 or ch 3. That looks much neater.
- Fasten off your work always with needle join and you'll get a neat result.
- Stuff your amigurumi as you go. I use a chopstick for that!
- Use a stitch marker or a piece of yarn to mark the beginning of a round.
- Snowflake using the materials described is ~11 inches / 28 cm tall.

<u>Legs for Snowflake II</u> with leggings - yarn H - stuff the legs as you go

Use the same pattern as for the legs for *Snowflake I* but instead of using the color for the skin and underwear (yarn B and C) use yarn H and make some stitches with yarn I (see page 5). Don't forget that you have to change the place of your stitch marker after rnd 38!

Crochet the leggings until round 47 of the body. For round 47-60 use yarn E (skirt) and change to the color of the skin.



Body - yarn C - stuff the body as you go



Ch 3 and join to the 1st leg with a sc (this counts as the first sc of the following 12 sc).



Dress - yarn D

Chains at the beginning of a rnd does not count as a stitch. Crochet the first st until rnd 9 always in the same st as the chains.

Arms of dress - yarn D

Join yarn with a standing sc into the 1st loop of round 4.

rnd stitches

- 1 6 sc, 1 sc in the side of the sc, 6 sc in flo of rnd 5, 1 sc in the side of the sc, join with a slst into the 1st
- 2 Ch 2, 13 hdc, don't join rnds until now with a slst - work in a continuous spiral (14)
- 3-9 (7 rnds) 14 hdc (14)

(14)

- \rightarrow Change to yarn E.
- 10 *sc, tr* 7x (14)
 - → Break yarn and fasten off your work invisible. You can use a button, a snap or just close the back by sewing the stitches together.





Gloves - yarn F

rnd	stit	stitches

→ Break yarn and fasten off your work invisible. Crochet a 2nd glove. Join yarn B with a slst in the middle sc of round 6 and ch 60. Join with a slst in the middle sc of rnd 6 of the 2nd glove and fasten off your work.



Scarf - yarn G

If you want a wider cord chain 4 or 5 at the beginning.

Ch 3, insert hook in 2nd ch from hook and draw up a loop (2 loops on your hook). Insert your hook in next st and draw up a loop (3 loops on your hook). Drop loops 2 and 3 off the hook and ch 1. Insert hook in next loop and ch 1. Now insert hook in the last loop and ch 1. Repeat that for every row until you reached your desired length. Break yarn and finish off your work by pulling the yarn through all the three loops on your hook, ch 1 and pull the remaining yarn trough the last stitch completely. Cut 3-4 strands of yarn and attach them at the beginning and the end of the scarf.















Details:

- Use a bit blush for the cheeks of your doll.
- Take a piece of ribbon or yarn and sew the shoelaces onto the booties.
- Embroider some snowflakes onto the dress with a piece of yarn.
