## Materials:

- Yarn (see page one for yarns I've used)
- $2,5 \mathrm{~mm}$ hook size or a size that fits your yarn
- 2 black 6 mm security eyes
- Embroidery thread for the details on the dress
- Scissors
- Stuffing
- Tapestry needle
- Stitch marker
- Pins
- Ribbon for the shoelaces



## Abbreviation/US terminology:

| blo | - | back loop |
| :---: | :---: | :---: |
| ch | - | chain |
| dc | - | double crochet |
| dc3tog | - | double crochet three together |
| dec | - | decrease |
| flo | - | front loop |
| hdc | - | half double crochet |
| inc | - | increase |
| rnd(s) | - | round(s) |
| sc | - | single crochet |
| sc3tog | - | single crochet three together |
| slst | - | slip stitch |
| st | - | stitch |
| tr | - | treble stitch |
| (...) | - | number in parentheses indicates the number of stitches at the end of the round |

| $\{\ldots\}$ | - | work the stitches all into the same stitch |

## Notes:

- Do not join rounds, work in a continuous spiral unless otherwise stated.
- Change your yarn always in the last step of the last stitch.
- I mostly go up with a standing sc, hdc or dc instead of ch 1 , ch 2 or ch 3 . That looks much neater.
- Fasten off your work always with needle join and you'll get a neat result.
- Stuff your amigurumi as you go. I use a chopstick for that!
- Use a stitch marker or a piece of yarn to mark the beginning of a round.
- Snowflake using the materials described is $\sim 11$ inches $/ 28 \mathrm{~cm}$ tall.

$\rightarrow$ Break yarn and fasten off your work. Stuff the booties.


Legs for Snowflake I without leggings (see part 'Legs Snowflake II' if you want her to wear a leggings) - yarn B - stuff the legs as you go
rnd
stitches
$20 \quad$ in blo of rnd 1912 sc
21-38 ( 18 rnds) $12 \mathrm{sc}+7 \mathrm{sc}$ after rnd 38 (to reach the back of your work)
$\rightarrow$ Place a stitch marker into the last stitch you've made. This is your new beginning of the next rounds. Change to yarn C.
39-40 (2 rnds) 12 sc
$\rightarrow$ Break yarn and work a $2^{\text {nd }}$
leg the same way but crochet
4 sc more after rnd 40 and
don't break yarn this time!
Legs for Snowflakee II with leggings - yarn H stuff the legs as you go

Use the same pattern as for the legs for Snowflake I but instead of using the color for the skin and underwear (yarn B and C) use yarn $H$ and make some stitches with yarn I (see page 5). Don't forget that you have to change the place of your stitch marker after rnd 38!
Crochet the leggings until round 47 of the body. For round 47-60 use yarn E (skirt) and change to the color of the skin.

Ch 3 and join to the $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{leg}$ with a sc (this counts as the first sc of the following 12 sc ).

$\rightarrow$ Place a stitch marker into the last stitch you've made. This is your new beginning of the next rounds.

## Dress - yarn D

Chains at the beginning of a rnd does not count as a stitch. Crochet the first st until rnd 9 always in the same st as the chains.

1 Ch 23, in $3^{\text {rd }}$ ch from hook
(crochet the st in the back
bump behind the ch for a neat result) 2 hdc , *2 hdc, inc* $5 \mathrm{x}, 4 \mathrm{hdc}$, ch 2 and turn
$23 \mathrm{hdc}, * 3 \mathrm{hdc}$, inc* $^{2 x}, 3 \mathrm{hdc}$, ch 1 and turn
$3 \quad 31$ sc, ch 1 and turn
4 in flo $4 \mathrm{sc}, 6$ ch, skip 6 sc, $11 \mathrm{sc}, 6 \mathrm{ch}$, skip 6 sc , 4 sc , ch 2 and turn
$4 \mathrm{hdc}, 6 \mathrm{hdc}$ in blo of ch $6,11 \mathrm{hdc}, 6 \mathrm{hdc}$ in blo of ch $6,4 \mathrm{hdc}$, ch 2 and turn
65 hdc, inc, 19 hdc, inc, 5 hdc
7-8 (2 rnds) Ch 2, 33 hdc
$9 \quad$ Ch $3, \mathrm{dc}$ in same st, $*\{2 \mathrm{dc}\}^{*}$ slst in top of ch 3 of the same rnd. Don't turn your work until now!
10-15 (6 rnds) ch 3, 65 dc , slst in top of ch 3
16 in flo ch $3,65 \mathrm{dc}$
$\rightarrow$ Break yarn and fasten off your work invisible.
17 With color E in blo of rnd 16 ch $3,65 \mathrm{dc}$, slst in top of ch 3
18
Ch 3, 65 dc
$\rightarrow$ Break yarn and fasten off your work invisible.


Don't forget to start to crochet in rounds after row 9.



## Arms of dress - yarn D

Join yarn with a standing sc into the $1^{\text {st }}$ loop of round 4.

## rnd

stitches
$166 \mathrm{sc}, 1 \mathrm{sc}$ in the side of the sc, 6 sc in flo of rnd $5,1 \mathrm{sc}$ in the side of the sc, join with a slst into the $1^{\text {st }}$ sc
Ch 2, 13 hdc , don't join rnds until now with a slst - work in a continuous spiral
3-9 (7 rnds) 14 hdc
$\rightarrow$ Change to yarn E.
$10 \quad$ *sc, $\operatorname{tr}^{*} 7 \mathrm{x}$
$\rightarrow$ Break yarn and fasten off your work invisible. You can use a button, a snap or just close the back by sewing the stitches together.



## Gloves - yarn F

rnd stitches

| 1 | 4 sc in a magic ring | $(4)$ |
| :--- | :--- | :--- |
| 2 | 4 inc | $(8)$ |
| $3-4$ | (2 rnds) 8 sc | $(8)$ |
| 5 | dc3tog, 7 sc | $(8)$ |
| 6 | 8 sc | $(8)$ |

$\rightarrow$ Break yarn and fasten off your work invisible. Crochet a $2^{\text {nd }}$ glove. Join yarn B with a slst in the middle sc of round 6 and ch 60 . Join with a slst in the middle sc of rnd 6 of the $2^{\text {nd }}$ glove and fasten off your work.


## Scarf - yarn G

If you want a wider cord chain 4 or 5 at the beginning.

Ch 3, insert hook in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{ch}$ from hook and draw up a loop (2 loops on your hook). Insert your hook in next st and draw up a loop (3 loops on your hook). Drop loops 2 and 3 off the hook and ch 1 . Insert hook in next loop and ch 1 . Now insert hook in the last loop and ch 1 . Repeat that for every row until you reached your desired length. Break yarn and finish off your work by pulling the yarn through all the three loops on your hook, ch 1 and pull the remaining yarn trough the last stitch completely. Cut 3-4 strands of yarn and attach them at the beginning and the end of the scarf.



## Details:

- Use a bit blush for the cheeks of your doll.
- Take a piece of ribbon or yarn and sew the shoelaces onto the booties.

- Embroider some snowflakes onto the dress with a piece of yarn.
