THE LLAMA

Logan is very fond of his comfort teddy, bringing him wherever he goes. Teddy was gifted to Logan at a young age, and Logan has cherished him ever since.

Logan is quite the relaxed llama- you'll often find him listening to records in his library or with a great novel in his hand- he's currently listening to Llama del Rey.

He currently works part time at the llama day care, but aspires to one day be a kindergarten teacher.

A blue sparrow handmade pattern
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NOTES FOR THE PATTERN

- Instructions are written in rounds & rows, using US terminology.
- Change colours when indicated using the invisible colour change method on the last stitch before the new colour.
- The number of stitches you should have at the end of each round is written in the brackets like so, (20).
- Make sure you pull your stitches tight and always use a stitch marker, or piece of string, to mark the start of each round.
- Most importantly, have fun whilst crocheting this pattern, and feel free to reach out if you have any issues along the way.

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WHAT YOU WILL NEED

I have used DMC Natura Just cotton yarn with the colours:

- 036 - Gardenia - beige (1x 50g ball)
- 037 - Canelle - light brown (less than 25g)
- 081 - Acanthe - light orange (less than 25g)
- 001 - Ibiza - white (less than 25g)
- 087 - Glacier - light blue (less than 25g)
- 044 - Agatha - brown (less than 25g)
- Black & white embroidery thread
- A 2.25 mm crochet hook
- Safety eyes (7 mm)
- Toy stuffing
- Yarn needle
- Stitch Markers
- Pins
- Scissors

You can use any yarn of your choice, just adjust your crochet hook according to the yarn.

CROCHET TERMS USED // ABBREVIATIONS GUIDE (US TERMINOLOGY):

Below are basic explanations of the crochet terms used in this pattern.

- **CHAIN (ch)** With a loop on your hook, yarn over from back to front and pull the loop through
- **STITCH (st)**
- **MAGIC RING (mr)** Wrap yarn over two fingers twice forming an X. Place the hook under the first piece of yarn and then over the second piece of yarn. Pull the outer strand of yarn under the first strand of the X forming a loop. Yarn over once more and draw the yarn through both loops. Work the appropriate number of stitches into the loop by inserting the hook into the main circle space onto the other side, yarning over and pulling through the space in the middle, yarn over the hook and pull through both loops on the hook. Once you have crocheted the number of stitches required, pull the short bit of string to tighten the ring
- **SINGLE CROCHET (sc)** Insert your hook into a stitch, yarn over (I prefer to pull the yarn through with my hook on top of the yarn to create a X effect), pull the yarn through (two chains on the hook), yarn over once more and pull the yarn through both loops
- **SLIP ST (slst)** Put your hook through the stitch, yarn over, pull through the stitch, and then pull the yarn through the loop on your hook
- **INCREASE (inc)** Work 2 single crochets into the same stitch
- **INV DECREASE (dec)** Insert your hook under the front loop of the first stitch, and then under the front loop of the second stitch. Yarn over and pull through both front loops. Yarn over and pull through the remaining loops

Construction:

- > The legs are made as two separate pieces that get joined together. Once joined, they will then form the body.
- > The hair fluff on the head is made as two separate parts that get joined together to form one piece.
- > All other pieces of the llama are made separately and are sewn on.
- > Overalls are worked as one piece and then placed onto the llama.
- > All pieces of the teddy are sewn together.

Skill level: beginner-intermediate

Size: Logan measures approximately 25 cm // 10 inches (top of ears to feet) when made with the above materials.

Instructions

HEAD

Use beige

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4:** sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5, sc (24)
- Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (30)
- Rnd 6:** 2 sc, inc in the next st, (4 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 2 sc (36)
- Rnd 7:** (5 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (42)
- Rnd 8:** 3 sc, inc in in the next st, (6 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 3 sc (48)
- Rnd 9-11:** sc in all st (48) 3 rounds
- Rnd 12:** (7 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (54)
- Rnd 13-16:** sc in all st (54) 4 rounds
- Rnd 17:** 4 sc, inc in the next st, (8 sc, inc in the next st) x5, 4 sc (60)
- Rnd 18-23:** sc in all st (60) 6 rounds
- Rnd 24:** (8 sc, dec) x6 (54)
- Rnd 25:** 2 sc, dec, (4 sc, dec) x8, 2 sc (45)

Insert the safety eyes between rnds 16-17 with approximately 7 "whole" visible stitches. Using black embroidery thread, sew eyebrows 4 rows above the eyes on a diagonal across 2 stitches. **FIGURE 1** Weave in the yarn tail once complete. Stuff the head and continue throughout.

- Rnd 26:** (3 sc, dec) x9 (36)
- Rnd 27:** sc in all st (36)
- Rnd 28:** (2 sc, dec) x9 (27)
- Rnd 29:** (7 sc, dec) x3 (24)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.

SNOUT

Use beige

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2:** inc in all st (12)
- Rnd 3:** (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)
- Rnd 4:** sc, inc in the next st, (2 sc, inc in the next st) x5, sc (24)
- Rnd 5:** 3 sc, (inc in the next st) x2, 13 sc, (inc in the next st) x2, 4 sc (28)
- Rnd 6-8:** sc in all st (28) 3 rounds

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing. The snout will be stuffed during assembly. Using black embroidery thread, sew a "Y" nose onto the snout. The top of the "Y" extends up to rnd 5, and the bottom extends to rnd 4. Weave in the yarn tail once complete. **FIGURE 3**

EARS (MAKE 2)

Use beige

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)
- Rnd 2:** sc in all st (5)
- Rnd 3:** inc in all st (10)
- Rnd 4-5:** sc in all st (10) 2 rounds
- Rnd 6:** (sc, inc in the next st) x5 (15)
- Rnd 7-16:** sc in all st (15) 10 rnds

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing. The ears are not stuffed.

HAIR FLUFF

Use light brown. You will make 2 pieces that join together to form one.

Piece 1

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 5 (5)
- Rnd 2:** sc in all st (5)
- Rnd 3:** inc in all st (10)
- Rnd 4-5:** sc in all st (10) 2 rounds
- Rnd 6:** (3 sc, dec) x2 (8)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. The piece is not stuffed.

Piece 2

- Rnd 1:** start with a mr of 6 (6)
- Rnd 2:** (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)
- Rnd 3:** sc in all st (9)
- Rnd 4:** (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)
- Rnd 5:** (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)
- Rnd 6-7:** sc in all st (15) 2 rounds
- Rnd 8:** (3 sc, dec) x3 (12)
- Rnd 9:** (2 sc, dec) x3 (9)

Do not fasten off, instead continue:

- Rnd 10:** sc into any st of the first piece **FIGURE 2** (this will mark the start of the rnd), then sc in the next 7 st of the first piece (8 in total on piece 1), sc into the next st along of the second piece, and sc in the remaining 8 st (9 in total on piece 2) (17)
- Rnd 11-12:** sc in all st (17) 2 rounds
- Rnd 13:** 4 sc, dec, 6 sc, dec, 3 sc (15)
- Rnd 14:** 13 sc, dec (14)

Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. Leave a yarn tail for sewing. The hair fluff is not stuffed.

LEGS - (MAKE 2)

Begin with beige. You will make 2 legs that join together.

Leg 1

Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)

Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

Rnd 4: (8 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (20)

Rnd 5-22: sc in all st (20) 18 rounds

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. Stuff the leg.

Leg 2

Rnd 1-22: As per rounds 1-22 of leg 1.

Stuff the leg. Do not fasten off, instead, continue onwards.

Rnd 23: ch 3, sc into any st of leg 1 **FIGURES 4-5** (this will mark your new starting point), continue with 19 sc into leg 1. Work 3 sc into the back of the chain, 20 sc into leg 2 and 3 sc into the ch (46)

You have now joined the legs and we will continue to work on the body.

BODY

Rnd 24: sc in all st (46)

Rnd 25-31: sc in all st (46) 7 rounds

Rnd 32: sc in all st (46) *change to white on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 33: sc in all st (46)

Rnd 34: sc in all st (46) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 35: sc in all st (46) *change to white on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 36: sc in all st (46)

Rnd 37: sc in all st (46) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 38: sc in all st (46) *change to white on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 39: sc in all st (46)

Rnd 40: 12 sc, dec, 22 sc, dec, 8 sc (44) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 41: sc in all st (44) *change to white on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 42: 12 sc, dec, 20 sc, dec, 8 sc (42)

Rnd 43: (12 sc, dec) x3 (39) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 44: sc in all st (39) *change to white on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 45: (11 sc, dec) x3 (36)

Rnd 46: 5 sc, dec, (10 sc, dec) x2, 5 sc (33) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*

Stuff the body and continue throughout.

Rnd 47: (4 sc, dec) x5, 3 sc (28) *change to white on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 48: sc in all st (28)

Rnd 49: (5 sc, dec) x4 (24)

Fasten off, leaving a yarn tail for sewing.

ARMS - (MAKE 2)

Begin with beige.

Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)

Rnd 2: (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)

Rnd 3: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (12)

Rnd 4: (3 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (15)

Rnd 5-6: sc in all st (15) 2 rounds

Rnd 7: 3 sc, (dec) x3, 6 sc (12)

Rnd 8-15: sc in all st (12) 8 rounds

Stuff the arm for the first 15 rounds. Leave the remaining rounds.

Rnd 16: sc in all st (12) *change to white on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 17: sc in all st (12)

Rnd 18: sc in all st (12) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 19: sc in all st (12) *change to white on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 20: sc in all st (12)

Rnd 21: sc in all st (12) *change to orange on the last st of the rnd*

Rnd 22: sc in all st (12)

Rnd 23: 3 sc in all st. Stop the round here.

You should be at the side of the work, flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. Leave a tail for sewing.

OVERALLS

Use blue. Begin with a ch of 26, form a circle, and slst to the beginning ch. Make sure your work isn't twisted.

First Leg Sleeve

Rnd 1: sc in all st (26)

Rnd 2-4: sc in all st (26) 3 rounds

Rnd 5: (12 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (28)

Rnd 6-7: sc in all st (28) 2 rounds

Rnd 8: (13 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (30)

Rnd 9-10: sc in all st (30) 2 rounds

Rnd 11: (14 sc, inc in the next st) x2 (32)

Rnd 12-14: sc in all st (32) 3 rounds

After making the first leg sleeve, fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.

Second leg sleeve

Rnd 1-14: as per the first leg sleeve (32)

Do not fasten off. Instead, we will join the two sleeves to complete the overalls.

Joining the pant sleeves

Rnd 15: with the second leg sleeve on your hook, work the next sc into any st of the first leg sleeve to join the two pieces **FIGURE 6**, continue, 14 sc, inc in the next st, (15 sc, inc in the next st) x3 (68)

Rnd 16: (16 sc, inc in the next st) x4 (72)

Rnd 17-19: sc in all st (72) 3 rounds

Rnd 20: (16 sc, dec) x4 (68)

Rnd 21: 15 sc, dec, sc, dec, 28 sc, dec, sc, dec, 15 sc (64)

Rnd 22: sc in all st (64)

Rnd 23: 14 sc, dec, sc, dec, 27 sc, dec, sc, dec, 13 sc (60)

Rnd 24-27: sc in all st (60) 4 rounds

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.

We will now mark out 4 places on the pants to establish where we will rejoin the yarn to complete the two panels of the overalls. Find 16 sc at the front and back of the work to form the top parts of the overalls. I suggest you look at your completed work and mark the stitches that look central to you. There should be 14 sc on either side, where we will not work into, and will form the gaps for the arms. (16 for the back panel + 14 on the side + 16 for the front panel + 14 on the opposite side) **FIGURES 12-13**

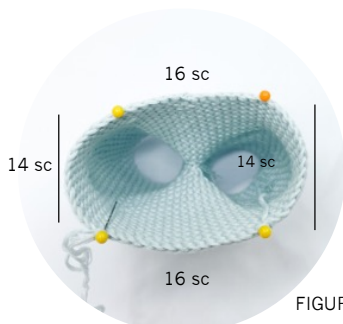

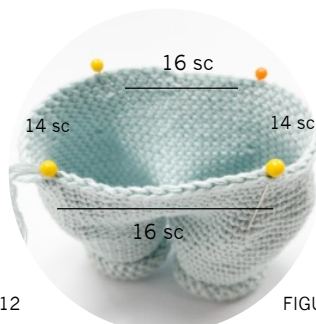

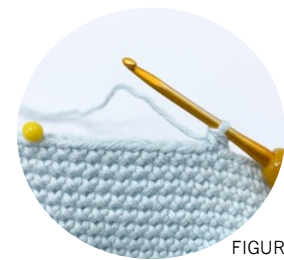

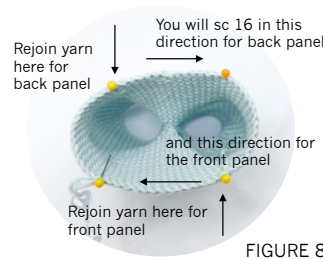

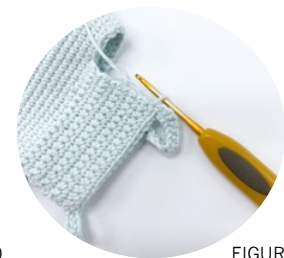

It is important to create the back panel of the overalls first.

Row 1: Rejoin the blue yarn to the first sc of the marked 16 stitches that you would like to form the back side of the llama's overalls **FIGURES 7-8**. Sc in all 16 st (16) ch 1 and turn

Row 2-9: sc in all st (16) ch 1 and turn. 8 rounds

Row 10: sc in all st (16)

Fasten off and weave in the yarn tail.

Now we will create the front panel.

Row 1: Rejoin your yarn in the first sc of the next marked 16 stitches **FIGURES 7-8** (it will be 14 sc from the last st of your back panel). Sc in all 16 st (16) ch 1 and turn

Row 2-9: sc in all st (16) ch 1 and turn. 8 rounds

Row 10: sc in all st (16)

Do not fasten off, instead we will begin to form the straps of the overalls.

Row 11: ch 11, slst into the first sc of the back panel to join **FIGURE 9**. Twist your work slightly, and now sc 10 back down the ch towards the front panel **FIGURE 10**, then sc into the next 16 st (including the sc where you would have begun the ch) of the front panel, ch 11 again, slst into the last sc of the back panel to join. Twist your work slightly, and sc 10 back down the ch. Slst into the side of the front panel to neatly join the last strap

FIGURE 11.

You can now fasten off and weave in the yarn tail. Fold the bottom parts of the leg panels over to create a 'cuff' look. **FIGURES 14-15**

Assembly

Weave in all yarn tails as you go.

Snout to the head: Sew the snout between rounds 15-16 and downwards to rounds 24-25. The snout should sit between the eyes. Be sure to stuff the snout before closing. **FIGURES 18-19**

Head Fluff to the head: Pin the head fluff over the head's magic ring, with the closing sc's sitting between rounds 5-6 of the back of the head (facing away from the front of the face). Once pinned in place, sew along the closing stitches and along the sides of the fluff, and a few stitches of each head fluff piece. Do not sew through the whole piece, but only the sides of the work that lay on the head, in order to keep the 3D look. **FIGURES 16-21**

Ears to the head: Pin the ears either side of the head fluff. Make sure the ears are positioned centre to the head fluff - where the magic ring would likely be. Pinch them together and sew them between rounds 5-6. **FIGURES 19-22**

Head to the body: Sew the head to the body. Make sure you are happy with the stuffing of each piece before you close.

Arms to the body: Sew the arms on either side of the body between rounds 47-48. You can put the overalls on first if it helps you position the arms. **FIGURES 23-25**

Overalls: Place the overalls onto the llama.

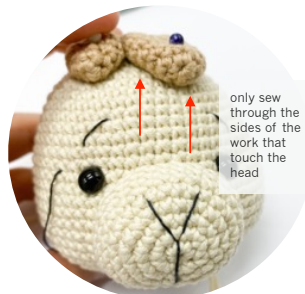

Teddy Bear

ARMS & LEGS (MAKE 4)

Use brown.

You will make 4 pieces in total, 2 for the arms, and 2 for the legs

Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)

Rnd 2-6: sc in all st (6) 5 rounds

Flatten the work and sc through both sides to close. The arms/legs are not stuffed. Leave a tail for sewing.

BODY

Use brown

Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)

Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

Rnd 4-6: sc in all st (18) 3 rounds

Rnd 7: (sc, dec) x6 (12)

Rnd 8-9: sc in all st (12) 2 rounds

Rnd 10: (2 sc, dec) x3 (9)

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. Stuff the body.

HEAD

Use brown.

Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)

Rnd 2: inc in all st (12)

Rnd 3: (sc, inc in the next st) x6 (18)

Rnd 4: (2 sc, inc in the next st) x6 (24)

Rnd 5-10: sc in all st (24) 6 rounds

Rnd 11: (2 sc, dec) x6 (18)

Rnd 12: (sc, dec) x6

Rnd 13: (2 sc, dec) x3 (9)

Fasten off, and weave in the yarn tail. Stuff the head.

Using black & white embroidery thread, embroider the eyes on rounds 7-8. Once complete, sew a nose between the eyes in a "T" shape. **FIGURE 26** Weave in the thread tail.

EARS (MAKE 2)

Use brown

Rnd 1: start with a mr of 6 (6)

Rnd 2: (sc, inc in the next st) x3 (9)

Rnd 3: sc in all st (9)

Fasten off, leaving a tail for sewing. The ears are not stuffed.

Assembly

Weave in all yarn tails as you go.

Ears to head: Sew the ears between rounds 2-3, in line with the magic ring. The ears should extend down to rounds 6-7. **FIGURES 27-28**

Body to head: Sew the body to the head. Make sure you are happy with the stuffing before fully closing.

Arms to body: Sew the arms to the sides of the body between rounds 9-10. **FIGURES 29-30**

Legs to body: Sew the legs to the sides of the body between rounds 3-4. **FIGURES 29 & 31**

You can choose to keep the teddy bear loose, or to sew one of the teddy's arms to the llama.
