
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
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### VIDEO AND QR CODES:





Eye-tightening video. Press the button or scan the code.



Video work sc into the body of stitches in the previous round. Press the button or scan the code.



Video on embroidering a smile. Click the button or scan the code.



Video on connect legs. Press the button or scan the code.



### MPORTANT INFORMATION:



- In this pattern, I give recommendations on where to modify the beginning of the round. Pay attention! The look and evenness of your product depends on this.
- Your toy size may differ from mine. It depends on the materials, the hook, and the tension of your crocheting.
- I also recommend taking exactly the hook that is convenient for you, for this or that yarn. All materials presented in this pattern were used to create these particular toys and are of a recommendatory nature.
- The growth of the Scarecrow is 26 cm. (using the indicated materials)
- All details are crochetted in a spiral, except where specified.
- Yarnart jeans (160m/50g), alize cotton gold (330m/100g), gazal jeans, alize cotton gold hobby yarns have almost the same footage and weight, so these models can be replaced with each other.







- Hook № 2 (B 2.00 mm)
- Fibrefill
- Scissors
- Long tapestry needle for a thread mount
- Needle for sewing pieces
- Safety eyes size 7-8 mm; for pumpkin: 6 mm and 8 mm
- Thin plastic for insoles
  - Wire (1.5 mm) and electrical tape optional

- 1. Alize Cotton Gold, color 262 beige (1 skein)
- 2. Alize Cotton Gold, color 36 terracotta (0.5 skein)
- 3. Alize Cotton Gold, color 493 brown (< 0.5 skein)
- 4. Alize Cotton Gold, color 02 mustard (0.5 skein)
- 5. YarnArt Jeans, color 05 light beige (< 0.5 skein)
- 6. YarnArt Jeans, color 86 light yellow (< 0.5 skein) For pumpkin:
- 1. Alize Cotton Gold, color 83 dark yellow (< 0.5 skein)
  - 2. YarnArt Jeans, color 92 dark green (< 0.5 skein)

#### Bobble st (4dctof):



#### Row start marker:

In this pattern, in some details, it is necessary to move the beginning of the row for the evenness of the product, obtaining a certain shape or convenience.

If it is indicated that we need to transfer the marker of the beginning of the row as shown in the photo or described in words, then you need to crochet or dissolve the required number of loops to this place. Set the marker in a new place and continue crocheting according to the pattern. When the marker of the beginning of the row is shifted, the number of loops remains unchanged.



#### FLO - crochet through front loops only

When crocheting for the front half loops, we grab the half loop that is closer to us. Pay attention to how many loops or rows are crocheted in this way.

#### BLO - crochet through back loops only

When crocheting for the back half loops, we grab the half loop that is farther from us. Pay attention to how many loops or rows are crocheted in this way.

Start to crochet in beige color. Stuff as you go.

- 1 rnd: 6 sc in MR 2 rnd: 6 inc (12) 3 rnd: (1 sc; inc)\*6 (18)
- 4 rnd: (2 sc; inc)\*6 (24)
- 5 rnd: (3 sc; inc)\*6 (30)
- 6 rnd: (4 sc; inc)\*6 (36)
- 7 rnd: (5 sc; inc)\*6 (42)
- 8 rnd: (6 sc; inc)\*6 (48)
- 9 rnd: (7 sc; inc)\*6 (54)
- 10 rnd: (8 sc; inc)\*6 (60)
- 11-23 rnd (13 rounds): 60 sc



Insert the eyes on the secure mount between the 18th and 19th rounds. The distance between the holes for the eyes 10 sc (photo 1).

- 26 rnd: (6 sc; dec)\*6 (42)
- 27 rnd: (5 sc; dec)\*6 (36)

## PATCH:

Start to crochet in brown color. Make chain 5 ch, crochet from the second loop from the hook turn row:

1-2 row (2 rows): 4 sc; ch

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.




## HEAD DESIGN:

1. We make an eye-tightening, as shown in the video (page 1) (photo 5).

2. Embroider the whites of the eyes with white yarn (photo 6).

3. We embroider the nose with stitches of beige yarn between 20 and 21 rounds. Spout width 5 sc (photo 7).









4. We embroider a smile with a thin black thread. On page 1, watch the video on how to embroider an even smile.

Points for a smile (photo 8):

HEAD DESIGN:

- points 1 and 2 between between 21 and 22 rounds, between points 18 sc.

- point 3 between 24 and 25 rounds in the center between points 1 and 2.






5. We fasten the hair.

We cut the beige yarn into pieces  $\sim 10$  cm (photo 10).

We fasten the bangs in the center of the head between 10 and 11 rounds, the width of the bangs is 6 segments.



#### HEAD DESIGN:



We trim the bangs and separate each thread with a needle (photo 16-18).




The bottom rounds of hair (along the back of the head) is done in a similar way. We attach the threads to the 13th rounds, stepping back from the edge of the bangs 10 sc to the sides. We separate all the threads with a needle.



6. Sew a patch on the side of the head (photo 21).

#### Start to crochen in terrakotta color.

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR 2 rnd: 6 inc (12) 3 rnd: (1 sc; inc)\*6 (18) 4 rnd: (2 sc; inc)\*6 (24) 5 rnd: (3 sc; inc)\*6 (30) 6 rnd: (4 sc; inc)\*6 (36) 7 rnd: (5 sc; inc)\*6 (42)

HAT:

- 8 rnd: (6 sc; inc)\*6 (48)
- 9 rnd: work sc into the body of stitches in the previous round (video page 1): 48 sc (photo 22-23)
- 10-15 rnd (6 rounds): 48 sc
- 16 rnd: FLO: (5 sc; inc)\*8 (56)
- 17 rnd: (6 sc; inc)\*8 (64)
- 18 rnd: (7 sc; inc)\*8 (72)
- 19 rnd: (8 sc; inc)\*8 (80)
- 20 rnd: (9 sc; inc)\*8 (88)
- Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.

Mustard color make chain 50 ch, crochet from the 3rd loop from the hook: 1 rnd: 48 hdc Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.





### PATCH:

Start to crochet in brown color. Make chain 5 ch, crochet from the second loop from the hook turning rows:


1-2 rnd (2 rounds): 4 sc; ch

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.



## HAT ASSEMBLY:

 We fasten the beige yarn (3 pieces) to the base of the hat in the same way as we fastened the hair. Separating the threads with a needle (*photo 27*).
Sew on patch and strap (*photo 28-29*).





## LEGS:



Start to crochet in brown color. Stuff as you go.

Make chain 9 ch, crochet from the second loop from the hook:

1 rnd: 7 sc; 3 sc in last chain (do not turn your work, crochet on the other side of the chain) 6 sc; inc (18)

- 2 rnd: inc; 6 sc; 3 inc; 6 sc; 2 inc (24)
- 3 rnd: 1 sc; inc; 6 sc; (1 sc; inc)\*3; 6 sc; (1 sc; inc)\*2 (30)
- 4 rnd: 2 sc; inc; 6 sc; (2 sc; inc)\*3; 6 sc; (2 sc; inc)\*2 (36)

5 rnd: 3 sc; inc; 6 sc; (3 sc; inc)\*3; 6 sc; (3 sc; inc)\*2 (42)

We cut the insole from plastic to the size of the resulting oval (photo 30).

6 rnd: **BLO:** 42 sc

7-9 rnd (3 rounds): 42 sc

Move the marker of the beginning of the row to the center of the heel (photo 31).

10 rnd: 6 sc; (3 sc; dec)\*6; 6 sc (36)

11 rnd: 6 sc; (dec; 2 sc)\*6; 6 sc (30)

We insert the insole.

12 rnd: 6 sc; (1 sc; dec)\*6; 6 sc (24)

Change to beige color.

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13 rnd: BLO: (2 sc; dec)*6 (18)
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14 rnd: (1 sc; dec)\*6 (12)

15-23 rnd (9 rounds): 12 sc







Change to light beige color. 24 rnd: *BLO:* (3 sc; inc)\*3 (15) 25–26 rnd (2 rounds): 15 sc 27 rnd: (4 sc; inc)\*3 (18) 28–29 rnd (2 rounds): 18 sc 30 rnd: (5 sc; inc)\*3 (21) 31–32 rnd (2 rounds): 21 sc 33 rnd: (6 sc; inc)\*3 (24) 34 rnd: 24 sc



We fasten and cut the thread on the left leg, leave it on the right leg and continue crocheting.

# PATCH:


LEGS:

Crochet 2 pcs. light color and mustard color. Make chain 5 ch, crochet from the second loop from the hook turning rows:

1–4 rnd (4 rounds): 4 sc; ch

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.













#### Decor boot.

Attach the brown yarn to the front loops of Rnd 12. We introduce the hook as shown in *photo 34*.

1-3 rnd (3 rounds): 24 sc

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.





#### Decor pants.

Attach the light beige yarn to the front loops of Rnd 23. We introduce the hook as shown in *photo 36*.

1 rnd: 2 ch; 12 inc(dc) (24)

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.









Sew patches on the sides of the boots.





## **EG CONNECTION:**

Before we connect the two legs, we need to define the central loops of the inner thigh.

To do this, fold the legs parallel to the toe (*photo 42*). We mark the extreme loops with markers (*photo 43-44*). Pay attention to the photo and the fact that we left the thread on the right leg of the groot.

The marker for the beginning of the row should run along the back.





Also on page 1 there is a video in which I show how to connect the legs. On the right leg, where we keep the thread, crochet the number of sc to the marker (we also crochet sc in the marker loop).

Make chain 3 ch (*photo 45*) and attach the left leg to the marker loop using sc (*photo 46*). The marker for the beginning of the row should be on the back.



Attention! In the next row along the chain crochet INCREASES.

1 rnd: 24 sc on the left leg; 3 inc along the chain; 24 sc on the right leg; 3 inc along the chain (60)

2-7 rnd (6 rounds): 60 sc

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.

#### Let's move on to crochet the bottom of the sweater.

Start to crochet mustard color.

Make chain 72 ch, close in a ring, making sure that the chain is not twisted.

- 1–2 rnd (2 rounds): 72 sc
- 3 rnd: (22 sc; dec)\*3 (69)
- 4 rnd: 69 sc
- 5 rnd: (21 sc; dec)\*3 (66)
- 6 rnd: 66 sc
- 7 rnd: (20 sc; dec)\*3 (63)
- 8 rnd: 63 sc
- 9 rnd: (19 sc; dec)\*3 (60)



We do not cut the thread. We continue to crochet the body.

We put the detail of the sweater on the body. Crochet from the same loop that was the first at the beginning of the row (photo 50).



8 rnd: crochet, *capturing the loops of both parts:* 60 sc (photo 51) 9 rnd: 60 sc Move the marker of the beginning of the row to the center back (photo 52). 10 rnd: (18 sc; dec)\*3 (57) 11–13 rnd (3 rounds): 57 sc 14 rnd: (17 sc; dec)\*3 (54) Stuff as you go.

## **BODY**:



15-17 rnd (3 rounds): 54 sc 18 rnd: (16 sc; dec)\*3 (51) 19-20 rnd (2 rounds): 51 sc 21 rnd (15 sc; dec)\*3 (48) 22-23 rnd (2 rounds): 48 sc 24 rnd: (14 sc; dec)\*3 (45) 25-26 rnd (2 rounds): 45 sc 27 rnd: (13 sc; dec)\*3 (42) 28-29 rnd (2 rounds): 42 sc 30 rnd: (12 sc; dec)\*3 (39) 31-32 rnd (2 rounds): 39 sc 33 rnd: (11 sc; dec)\*3 (36) 34 rnd: (4 sc; dec)\*6 (30) 35 rnd: (3 sc; dec)\*6 (24) 36 rnd: (2 sc; dec)\*6 (18) Change to beige color. 37 rnd: BLO: 18 sc 38 rnd: 18 sc 39 rnd: BLO: 18 sc 40-41 rnd (2 rounds): 18 sc Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.

#### Crochet collar.

Attach the beige varn to the front loops of Rnd 38. We introduce the hook as shown in *photo 55*. 1 rnd: 2 ch; 18 inc(dc) (36) Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.











Start to crochet in terracotta color make chain 160 ch. Cut the yarn and fasten off.





Start to crochet in brown color. Make chain 8 ch, crochet from the second loop from the hook turning rows: 1–4 rnd (4 rounds): 7 sc; ch Cut the yarn and fasten off. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.





Start to crochet in beige color. Stuff as you go 2/3 part.

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR 2 rnd: 6 inc (12) 3 rnd: (3 sc; inc)\*3 (15) 4–6 rnd (3 rounds): 15 sc 7 rnd: 7 sc; bobble st; 7 sc (15) 8 rnd: 15 sc 9 rnd: (3 sc; dec)\*3 (12) 10–26 rnd (17 rounds): 12 sc

Cut the yarn and fasten off.







Start to crochet in mustard color. Make chain 24 ch, close in a ring, making sure that the chain is not twisted (photo 60).

1–2 rnd (2 rounds): 24 sc

3 rnd: (6 sc; dec)\*3 (21)

4 rnd: 21 sc

5 rnd: (5 sc; dec)\*3 (18)

6 rnd: 18 sc

7 rnd: (4 sc; dec)\*3 (15)

8 rnd: 15 sc

9 rnd: (3 sc; dec)\*3 (12)


We put a arm in the sleeve (photo 61).

10 rnd: *for the loops of both parts:* 12 sc (photo 62)

11-17 rnd (7 rounds): 12 sc

Fold the piece in half and crochet 6 sc through both sides. (photo 63).

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.












## NECK TIE:

Crochet in brown color, make chain 60 ch. Cut the yarn and fasten off.



### **ASSEMBLY AND DECORATION:**

1. Cut the beige yarn. Passes the segments to the base of the leg with a needle. Tie in a knot, trim with scissors to the same length. Separate with a needle into thin threads.

Repeat on the second leg.



2. Sew a large patch to the bottom of the jacket. We tie a belt.





### **ASSEMBLY AND DECORATION:**



3. We prepare a piece of wire 10 cm. We isolate the ends of the wire with electrical tape (photo 71). We insert into the body and into the head.



4. Sew the head to the body. In the process of sewing, we add filler to the neck. We tie a lace around the neck *(photo 73)*.

5. Sew the handles on the sides of the body between the 33rd and 34th rows of the body.

6. Sew the hat to the head.

#### **PUMPKIN:**





Start to crochet in dark yellow color. Stuff as you go. 1 rnd: 6 sc in MR 2 rnd: 6 inc (12) 3 rnd: (1 sc; inc)\*6 (18)

4-6 rnd (3 rounds): 18 sc

7 rnd: (2 sc; inc)\*6 (24)

8 rnd: 24 sc

9 rnd: FLO: (2 sc; inc)\*8 (32)

10 rnd: (3 sc; inc)\*8 (40)

11 rnd: (4 sc; inc)\*8 (48)

12 rnd: (5 sc; inc)\*8 (56)

13 rnd: (6 sc; inc)\*8 (64)

14-20 rnd (7 rounds): 64 sc

Insert the eyes on the secure mount between the 16th and 17th rounds. The distance between the holes for the eyes 5 sc

21 rnd: (6 sc; dec)\*8 (56)

22 rnd: (5 sc; dec)\*8 (48)

23 rnd: (4 sc; dec)\*8 (40)

24 rnd: (3 sc; dec)\*8 (32)

25 rnd: (2 sc; dec)\*8 (24)

26 rnd: (1 sc; dec)\*8 (16)

27 rnd: 8 dec

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Pull the opening closed. Weave in the thread ends inside of the piece.



### SHANK:

Start to crochet in green color. Stuff as you go.

1 rnd: 6 sc in MR 2-5 rnd (4 rounds): 6 sc

Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.





Start to crochet in green color. Make chain 21 ch, crochet from the second loop from the hook: 1 rnd: 20 s st Cut the yarn and fasten off. Leave a long end of thread for sewing.



### **ASSEMBLY AND DECORATION:**

1. We make pumpkin tightening from 9 to 27 rounds. We divide into shares and tighten the thread each time.





### **ASSEMBLY AND DECORATION:**



2. We make the top tightening.



- 3. Sew on the cutting and leaf.
- 4. Embroider a smile with thin black yarn.
- 5. Embroider the whites of the eyes with white
- yarn.





The pumpkin is ready!
